3. A Soviet captain stated that 91 railroad carloads of nakhorka would be stored at the depot in the near future.

25X1X4. [REDACTED] no German civilians employed at the depot would be discharged. However, he also learned from Soviet personnel that Soviet soldiers would be replaced by **Russian** women. German women, who had been discharged from kitchens and messhalls, were partly reemployed. \*\*

5. A lead seal was taken from a railroad car which had come from Brest-Litovsk.

25X1A\* [REDACTED] Comment. The information confirms the ration supply depot of the GOFG in Frankfurt/Oder. Information on the large quantities of supply stored there was contained in a previous report. See HGL-15655. Excluding shipments of nakhorka and other tobacco, 149 carloads of ration supplies arrived at the depot, and 106 carloads left the depot during the time covered by the present report. It is notable that the storage of large quantities of flour, in this case 32 carloads arrived and 57 carloads left, is continuing and that the storage of flour was observed at army supply depots in Eberswalde, Fuerstenberg, and Jueterbog.

25X1A\* [REDACTED] Comment. The information confirms the assumption that, in general, the dismissal of German personnel does not affect the supply system. Further information is required to determine if German personnel who were discharged have actually been reemployed with kitchens and messhalls of units.
