1. On 11 November 1951, the Beseler Kaserne on Teucheler Weg, Wittenberg (N 52/E 37), was about 75 percent occupied (about 800 troops). The troops wore red-bordered black epaulets, including some with tank insignia. Troops were observed engaged in maintenance work. The garages were occupied to capacity. [REDACTED]

2. On 14 November, the Beseler Kaserne was occupied to capacity by about 1,500 troops who wore red-bordered black epaulets, mostly with tank insignia. [REDACTED]

3. On 14 November, many officers wearing red-bordered black epaulets, mostly with tank insignia, were seen entering or leaving the Taentzien Kaserne on Berliner Strasse. Only one large building of the installation was occupied by enlisted personnel. The Taentzien Kaserne also contained commissaries. [REDACTED] leaving the installation. *

4. On 14 November, the Flak Kaserne was occupied to capacity by troops who wore red-bordered black epaulets, including some with tank and motor transport insignia. [REDACTED] was seen leaving the installation. **

5. A tank repair shop appeared to be located in the hutment on Nordend Strasse. [REDACTED]
