7. The pro-KMT(B) Kin Wah Chinese School of Kyaukmyaung was opened on 1 November 1951. About 200 pro-KMT(B) Chinese attended.
8. The CDL(B)-sponsored Zin Min Pao of 2 November 1951 reported that the pro-CDL(B) Chinese students of Chung Hwa Chinese School, Myaungmya, addressed copies of a leaflet to the overseas Chinese and the Board of Directors of the school to give effect to the resolution passed at the meeting held on 16 October 1951 that seven teachers for the primary classes be appointed by the School Board of Directors and another seven for the middle class be appointed by the Burma Chinese Teachers' Union (BCTU) which is pro-CDL(B). Since the Board of Directors of the school is predominantly pro-KMT(B), the appointment of the seven Chinese teachers for the middle school was not referred to the pro-CDL(B) BCTU, which caused dissatisfaction among the pro-CDL(B) students. Zin Min Pao urged all patriotic Overseas Chinese of Burma to help the students attain their demand.
9. Seven more members of the pro-CDL(B) Burma Chinese Shop Employees Association (BCSEA) have resigned from the BCSEA. The increasing number of resignations by members of the BCSEA is attributed to persecution of their families by the CCP regime in Communist China.
