1. Transloading Stations

CLASSIFICATION

- It is reported that two new transloading stations are to be built:
- a. At Vasarosnameny, serving the route through Beregszasz.
- b. At Hidasnémeti, serving the route through Kosice.

2. Rail Gauge Conversion

It is allegedly planned to convert the international line Csap-Satoraljau, bely-Miskolc to broad gauge, and both the Czech and Hungarian Ministries of Trussport have received orders from Russia to this effect.

The conversion is to be made on the '3-rail' system, and orders for the raw track have already been placed with the Diosgyör iron and steel works.

3. Russian-controlled railway organizations in Hungary

There has been a large increase, dating from 1 October 1951, in the number of persons employed by the Pussian-controlled railway organizations with the langarian State Railways, and the wage bill has risen from 90,000 forints per month to about 160,000 forints for Hungarian employees. This sum does not include additional Russian personnel, whose wages are met from the funds of the Russian milfrary organization.

Two new Russian railway Komendaturas have been set up. One new Komendatura is at Békésgyula, which deals with the whole of the Békés region, and to this is subordinated the new Komendatura of Békéscsaba.

4. In August work was started on a road along the Danube bank between Paks and Tolor.
