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In January 1952, a total of 25,344.1 tons of wheat arrived from the U.S.S.R., 20,897.1 tons of which were shipped by water. Of these 4,089 tons were shipped by inland vessels to Saxony via Buchtenberg and another 448 tons via Gross-Neudorf.

- 25X1 ** ☐ Comment. According to another report the S.S. Gochina arrived from Koenigsberg (Kaliningrad) with a cargo of wheat on 17 January. The lighter Yana also came from Kaliningrad according to the same report. The S.S. Nyes and S.S. Lundra are unknown. The latter may be the steamer Turaide.
