1. [redacted] in Canton, natural science workers, medical workers, college professors, and experts from relevant government organizations of Kwangtung formed an organization known as the Anti-Bacteriological Warfare Committee of Natural Science Workers (1684/2639/5261/3544/4430/1331/1562/0155/1201/ 0765/2585). This committee was to conduct investigations and make studies and recommendations "to counter American germ warfare"; it was also to give support to the Government in its "Resist America, Aid Korea, Protect Homes and Safeguard Country" campaign.
2. TING Ying (0002/7336)¹ was elected chairman, while TU Kuo-hsiang (2629/0948/1651).² CH'EN Ju-t'ang (7115/3067/2768),³ LI Ta-ch'ao (2621/6671/3390),⁴ and K'0 Lin (2688/7792)⁵ were elected deputy chairmen. The departmental organization and personnel of the committee were as follows:

Comment. This report is well supported by previous evidence.

1. Comment. TING Ying, or TING Wing, was reported [redacted] as a member of the preparatory committee of the Kwangtung People's Representative Assembly. 25X1
2. Comment. TU Kuo-hsiang, or TO Kwok-cheung, was head of the Kwangtung Cultural and Educational Department [redacted], he was reported to be a member of the Kwangtung Security Committee; [redacted] he was reported to be dean of the Kwangtung Revolutionary Political and Military University. 25X1
3. Comment. The New China News Agency, [redacted] named TU as president of the South China Normal College. 25X1
3. Comment. CH'EN Ju-tung, or CHAN Yu-tong, was reported [redacted] as chairman of the South China Relief Association and an executive of the Hong Kong Chinese Anti-Civil War League. [redacted] he was listed as a leading official of the China Democratic League (CDL) and the Kuomintang Revolutionary Committee. [redacted] he was resident secretary of the Kuomintang Revolutionary Committee and acting chairman of the Hong Kong-Kowloon branch of the CDL. [redacted] CH'EN moved to Canton and made a speech there supporting the United Front program. [redacted] it was reported in the Hua Chiao Jih Pao that the Communists had taken all administrative powers away from CH'EN in his post as chief of the Kwangtung Department of Health and had made him a complete puppet. 25X1

- [redacted] Comment. [redacted] CH'EN was head of the Kwangtung Sanitation Department and that he had organized a recruiting drive at Chungshan Medical College and other colleges in Canton to relieve the medical shortage among the Indochinese forces. 25X1
4. [redacted] Comment. [redacted], LI Ta-chiao, or LI Tat-chiu, was reported head of the Canton Public Health Department and concurrently deputy chief of the Canton Supervisory Commission. 25X1
5. [redacted] Comment. K'O Lin, or O Lun, [redacted] 25X1 25X1
 . He practised as a doctor in Macao and appears to have been one of the leading Chinese Communists there as well as a Macao representative of the South China Sub-Bureau. [redacted] he was reported to have gone to Moscow to represent the Chinese Communist Party at a medical conference.
- [redacted] Comment. According to information available to this office K'O was head of the Chinese Communists in Macao [redacted] 25X1
 [redacted] his activities as head of the liaison division of the Macao Underground Activities Station, South China Sub-Bureau. [redacted] K'O had been approved as chairman of the Macao Anti-American, Aid-Korea, and Anti-Agression Committee.
