- Yugoslav "pampering" of Albanian refugees is increasing. Each refugee receives a monthly subsidy, and an imminent issue of clothing and shoes has just been announced. In this manner, the Yugoslav Government is winning for itself the sympathy of Albanian refugees.
- The Government, however, continues to follow its own Communist line, and will tolerate not even the slightest refugee criticism of its policies, and particularly territorial policies. Any active refugee opposition results in rapid and silent elimination.
- The Prizren Committee, also known as the League of Albanian Refugees, is in essence only a wehicle for Yugoslav policies, which are executed almost exclusively by the UDB.
- 5. There is an enormous number of Albanian refugees in Yugoslavia who are anxious for their country's liberation at any cost, even to the point of renouncing Albania's territorial demands on Yugoslavia. The Yugoslavs proper are not interested in the political hues of the Albanian refugees, as long as the latter are willing instruments.

б.	The Yugoslavs endeavor to exploit men of the RKI who are in that country, largely for the purpose of learning the secrets of this political body. Although Yugoslav hatred of the BKI is strong, the Yugoslav attitude is somewhat tempered by their desire to learn what assurances have been given to the BKI, and by whom, concerning the various territorial questions.
**************************************	It is expected that in the near future the RKI is probably to be approached by an Albanian emissary from Yugoslavia. The latter will be under complete Yugoslav control and should be treated with the utmost diffidence.  50X1-HUM
8.	Yugoslav plans are directed toward taking positive steps to effect Albania's "liberation" and a new special organization will be set up for this specific purpose. In this connection, special operational radio communications courses have already been started, and no expense is to be spared. Teams are to enter Albania covertly in the near future to liberate the extended zone (sic) which will serve as a base for a revolt which is to liberate the entire country.
9.	Upon this occasion, the intention of the Yugoslavs is to parry resultant Western and Soviet reaction by inviting international commissions to make an on-the-spot investigation, in order to assure themselves that the undertaking is 100-per cent Albanian. These teams, however, will be under the very strict guidance of fully trusted Yugoslav agents and no activity which would be contrary to Yugoslav interests will be tolerated. When action commences, the writer will be able to furnish full information.
10.	The BKI is advised to determine the role which it will assume in the event of a revolt.  a passive attitude could easily result in the loss of potential strength in a Tugoslav-Liberated Albania.  50X1-HUM
