(N 53/Z 91) were vacant during the period from 19 to 26 May 1952.25X1C
Trucks carrying troops and billeting equipment were observed day
and night at that time proceeding in a southerly direction via 25X1C
Sperenberg, allegedly to Jueterbog. On 27 May, the installations
appeared vacant. A column of about 30 trucks

25X1 25X1 carrying troops and furniture was observed passing through Zossen and proceeding toward Wuensdorf. A general riding in sedan was seen following the column. the unit came from Potsdam and was bound for Wuensdorf. On 22 and 23 May, the officers of the officers' course left the Hindenburg Kaserne in Wuensdorf. Instructors and officer candidates were allegedly transferred to Fornstedt, for the period of one year. Elements stationed in Karlshorst were allegedly scheduled to occupy the installation. A total of 100 soldiers wearing black-bordered crimson epaulets had already arrived. The motor transport unit stationed in the Cambrai Kaserne had allegedly been transferred to the area of Jueterbog until 28 May. At that time, the barracks installation was again occupied to capacity, allegedly by infantry from Krampnitz. On 26 and 27 May, the units stationed in the Lutz Kaserne allegedly moved to the area of Lindau, probably southeast of Hagdeburg. Units previously stationed in Camp Zossen moved into the Lutz Kaserne, and Volkspolizei were scheduled to occupy Camp Zossen. According to the reference reports and the present report, the
regrouping might have the following results. Headquarters,

The 62d AAA Div (US) of the Third Gds Mecz Army the bulk of which has been carried in the Lutz Kaserne possibly moved to the Magdeburg area, as it appears that the Lindau area is not appropriate even for temporary quartering of troops. Therefore, it is believed that the division will be stationed near the Letzling Heath training area. However it is almost certain that the division is transferred only temporarily, as its permanent quarters will always be in the area of the Third Gds Necz Army. With the departure of units from the Wuensdorf-Zossen area, the vacated quarters seem to have been made available for other troops. It is undetermined whether these elements will come from Karlshorst and/or Potsdam including Krampnitz. According to available information, it is assumed that at least elements of the GOFG in Potsdam will move to the Wuensdorf area. With the regroupings, the officers' courses of the officer candidate school were apparently dissolved, and possibly the officers returned to their units. As this was done in connection with the teginning of the summer training at the troop training grounds, this measure does not seem to be unusual. It is rather certain, however, that a decentralization of Soviet offices and units has started in the area south and west of Berlin since the first half of May. Further information is required to determine how many quarters are vacated which, later on, could be occupied by Volkspolizei.
