25X1 1. [redacted] following vessels at the Baltiyskiy Zavod shipyard:

- a. A cruiser on the west building ways. It was equipped with four triple turrets, which were being installed. Other outfitting work was also in progress. The cruiser appeared to be ready for early launching.
- b. A cruiser under construction on the center building ways. The frame had been erected and installation of the plates was in progress but had not yet reached deck height.
- c. On the east building ways no work was in progress. The ways were completely empty.
- d. The Okt'yabrskaya Revolutsiya was undergoing repairs by the equipment wharf, together with another very large hull, which may possibly have been the ex-Marat (sic).

2. Along the wharf on the south side of the Marti shipyard a newly-constructed unpainted ship, which may possibly have been a large destroyer, was undergoing fitting. The ship apparently had been launched quite recently, and the turrets were not yet installed.
3. No ships under construction could be observed at the Zhdanov shipyard.


4. A destroyer, marked 173, was moored to the wharf. The forecastle deck terminated with a sheer amidships. In other respects the ship was of the usual type.

5. A destroyer [redacted] was observed under way outside Kronshtadt. It was newly-built and had a modern appearance and a straight deck line [redacted]. [redacted] It moved through the newly-formed ice without difficulty and at a good speed, while the ordinary ice breakers had some trouble in making their way. Both destroyers had two smokestacks, of which the forward one was somewhat larger and taller than the after. Both had tripod masts forward of the smokestacks.
