1. Chinese Communist supply depots for military aid to the Democratic Republic of Vietnam (DRV) are as follows:

a. Ch'inhsien (180-37, 21-58) depot. This depot is south of Ch'inhsien beside a temple on the eastern side of the Ch'inchiang. There are 28 warehouses with a total capacity for storing about 6,000 tons of supplies. Ammunition for mortars, machine guns, rifles, small arms, and artillery, which was shipped from Canton and Kuangchouwan, is stored there.

b. Nanning depot. This depot is east of Nanning, near the southern end of Ch'ihhsia (2776/7209) Mountain. There are 20 warehouses, arranged in several rows, about five meters apart. Each warehouse has a storage capacity of 60 tons. Mortar, rifle, and machine-gun ammunition is stored there pending shipment to Indochina.

2. The following ordnance depots in Indochina contain supplies furnished by the Chinese Communists:

a. Lang Son ordnance depot. This depot is at Chi Tinh (7741/0064), two kilometers northeast of Lang Son. Supplies are stored in 12 civilian houses, which were commandeered for the purpose. Each house holds from 20 to 40 tons of supplies. A total of about 300 tons of rifles, light and heavy machine guns, mortars, and various types of ammunition are usually stored there.

b. Cao Bang ordnance depot. This depot is one kilometer east of Cao Bang, on the northern side of the highway. Military supplies are stored in ten civilian houses.

3. In early May there was an increase in the amount of supplies for the DRV passing through Hengyang (112-36, 26-54), junction town in Hunan and terminus of the Kwangsi-Hunan Railway. The shipments included trucks, gasoline, tires, pharmaceuticals, cement, uniforms, and foodstuffs.
