3. WUENSDORF-ZOSSEN-JUETERBOG Area.

There are indications that the Command Echelon of the GOFG which moved to the area of WUENSDONF-ZOSSEN is quartered in the installations of Camp ZOSSEN and the adjoining underground installations,

Maybach I and Maybach II, which were occupied by the German Army High Command during World War II. The Panzertruppenschule in WUENSDORF was apparently occupied by administrative offices. The Hq of the Third Gds Mecz Army left its temporary quarters in Neues Lager, Justerbog, and moved to the Adolf Hitler Camp south of FORST ZINNA in early July.

The 199th Light Arty Brig of the Third Gds Mecz Army which apparently had to vacate the Eisenbahnpionier Kaserne in REMAGEN-KLAUSDORF for the 2d Gds AAA Div of the GOFG was transferred to the area of JUETERBOG in July.

4. Area of the Second Gds Army.

The 33d Gds Htz Rifle Regt of the 9th Gds Tank Div moved to the area of FUERSTERNERG from PASEWALK in mid-July. The Kavallerie Kaserne in PASE-WALK which had been vacated was occupied by the VP in late July.

Training and Field Exercises.

5. Division Training.

A number of the divisions were still confirmed in their previous training areas in July As no major movements from any of the training area either by rail or road were seen, the location is rather definitely believed to have remained the same as in June. Numerous battalion exercises were reported in addition to intensive individual training and training at squad level. Cooperation with tanks, artillery and engineers was observed in an increased number of instances. Close observation of units engaged in exercises revealed that attack was the principal problem with emphasis on immediate readiness for defense against counterattacks as well as ruthless pursuit. Snipers in trees were immediately employed in combat in woods even during attack. No practice of units simulating defense was noticed.

On the basis of the report on the OB of the Soviet ground forces in June 1952, the individual training areas are believed to have been occupied in July as follows:

Area of the Eighth Gds Army.

OHRDRUF: No change. A new tent camp west of the ALTES LAGER in OHRDRUF, which was occupied by units

of the Sighth Gds Army, was reported in mid-July. Individual units of the XXIX Gds Mtz Rifle Corps probably were temporarily in OHRDRUF for practices in July.

KINDEL: 57th Gds Ltz Rifle Div and 220th HV Tank SP Regt. As previously, the troop training grounds was not occupied to capacity. A training area for tanks and infantry was located in the EERKA. MINLA area and on wooded hills to the east.

Elements of the 21st Gds Hecz Div. The corps troops of the XXIX Gds Mtz Rifle Corps, which had been predominantly observed in KINDEL in June 1952, were repeatedly seen in LCSSA in July 1952. A permanent telephone line from LCSSA to the headquarters of this copps in NAULBURG tended to indicate that the corps was assigned this training area for the summor of 1952. Quarters and approach roads had been improved further. The principal quartering area was between the WIENE-LCSSA and WIENE-BURGWENDEN roads, and the firing ranges were for the southwest in the BURGWENDED for the

OTTERWISCH: The occupation had decreased in mid-July. As only about 120 soldiers are observed and as this training area is small, the significance of the area cannot be compared with that of the other troop training grounds.

The 2d Light Arty Brig (US) of the Second Gds Mecz Army allegedly was in the SPICK-GRANZIN area and not, as previously, in the PEUTSCHER forest. The bulk of the 9th Gds Tank Div and the 1st Mecz Div and the bulk of the 12th Gds Tank Div were at their posts in late July and early July respectively, while elements practiced in areas close to their posts and in ALTENERABOR.

Area of the Third Gds Necz Army.

Area of JUETERBOG:

The bulk of the 6th Gds Tank Div and the 14th Gds Mecz Div were confirmed there until mid-July 1952. AAA units of the 6th and 7th Gds Mecz Divs and 25th Tank Div of the Fourth 6ds Mecz Army were in JUETERBOG for firing practices during the period from early June to late July 1952.

WEISSWASSER: The 9th Mecz Div was confirmed in late June 1952. Information received until mid-July 1952 indicated no changes.

Area of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army.

Numerous trains carrying special units returning to TEMPLIN and LIEBEROSE from other training areas revealed that the units of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army were still at these troop training grounds. A new troop camp was under construction near VIETMANNSDORF in the area of TEMPLIN. A new branch line was scheduled to be built from VOGELSANG to the camp. *

Special Exercises.

6. a. Artillery.

After a reshuffle of units in mid-July, strong elements of the 5th Arty Div including the 25th KL Brig were still confirmed in ALTEN-GRABOW until late July. Howements probably of the 12hth Hv Moa Arty Brig (US) of the 6th Arty Div between BNANDENBURG and ALTEN-GRABOW and vice versa were closerved during the second half of July. A brigade of the 3hth Arty Div (US) started returning from ALTEN-GRABOW to POTSDAM in late July. As no elements of the other heavy artillery units of the two rifle armies which had been confirmed there in June were reported doparting, it is believed that they were still stationed there in July.

During the first days of July, artillery units, mortar units and RL units arrived in ALTENGRABOW, coming from the training areas. Elements of the following units were identified _________as they were unloaded:

Eighth Gds Army: The unidentified Arty Brig of the XXVIII Gds Mtz Rifle Crops, the 87th Gun Arty Regt of the 39th Gds Mtz Rifle Div, the 172d Gds How Arty Regt of the 20th Gds Mocz Div, the 94th RL Regt (US) of the XXIX Gds Mtz Rifle Corps and a mortar unit of the 57th Gds Mtz Rifle Div.

Third Shock Army: A rocket launcher unit of the LXXIX Htz Rifle Corps and an artillory unit of the 207th Htz Rifle Div.

First 3ds Mecz Arry: A rocket

A rocket launchor unit, probably of the 8th 3ds Mecz Div.

Second Gds Llecz

A rocket Launcher unit of the 9th Gds Tank Div.

Elements of the 199th Light Arty Drig were at ALTENGRABOW from 3 to 16 July 1952.

One artillery unit each of the 6th Gds Lecz Div and the 7th Gds Lecz Div.

At least elements of the aforementioned units returned to their permanent training grounds or posts in mid-July 1952. Other elements of these units subsequently arrived in ALTENGRABON and some departed again as early as late July

the 4th AT Arty Brig (US) on RUEGEN Island; the Eighth Gds Arty; and the Third and Fourth Gds Mecz Army. Elements of the army headquarters and the 63d AAA Div (US) as well as some not specifically identified units of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army were transported from Eberswalde to the area of ALTENGRABOW on 5 or 6 trains in late July. This transfor cannot be explained.

b. AAA Units.

The AAA units which had been confirmed in ALTENGRABOW in June 1952, were no longer observed in July. Numercus new AAA units of the 6th 6ds AAA Div (US) and all armies except the First and Second 6ds Necz Army arrived in ALTENGRABOW on about 20 July and some of them departed again after a stay of about 10 days.

Prior to mid-July, AAA firing at towed sleeve targets was seen almost daily at the WUSTROW AAA firing range. Some of the AAA units stationed in WUSTROW also roated subordinate units in July. Units identified:

Except for the AAA regiments of the lith Gds Lecz Div, no AAA units of combat divisions were identified in UUSTROW in July. These units apparently practiced predominantly at the ALTENERABOW and JUETERBOG training grounds. AAA units of the 6th and 7th Gds Necz Divs and the 25th Tank Div of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army were in JUETERBOG for firing practices from early June to late July.

c. Engineers.

Engineer training in river crossing continued at small engineer training areas and the training areas of the individual armies along the Elbe River. Reports have tended to indicate that the training was performed in phases and, in part, in the form of instruction courses for individual companies and battalions. Following preparatory training on small rivers such as the Saale, Havel, Spree and Neisse, the gngineer troop units were transferred to the Elbe River. There, they received training in the construction of ferries, and subsequently bridge building, apparently under the guidance of engineer regiments of the GOFC and armies. The rapidity of the more technique of bridge building was emphasized, scretimes even in the form of contests, and the training

These instruction courses ended with bridge building which, occasionally, was done within the framework of tactical exercises for tanks and infantry. Numerous rail shipments in addition to observations at the training areas were indicative of the rotation of engineer units. Observations made along the Elbe River from north to south in July included the following:

Beginning mid-July, engineer units of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army returned to the TEMPLIN and LIEBEROSE training grounds from the RATHENON (Havel River) -STEHDAL-ANNEBURG area. Tanks were seen crossing the river near STORKAU and ARNEBURG on ferries of from 4 to 6 pontoons during the period from 10 to 12 July 1952. The crossing near STORKAU was made in conjunction with a tactical exercise practicing the taking and evacuating of a bridgehead from west to east and visa versa.

Engineer units of the Third Shock Army practiced with infantry and artillery units of the 207th Litz Rifle Div at the BITTKAU training grounds on 14 July 1952. An instruction or command post exercise, involving the 7th Gds Tank Div in LETZLING HEATH and headquarters units of the Third Gds Mecz Army was simultaneously held farther north in the area near GRIEBEN on the Elbe River. The second phase of the training for engineer units of the Eighth Gds Army which began in mid-July apparently terminated with the building of bridges in the area of DESSAU and AKEN during the period from 15 to 19 July. However, the departure of the units could not be observed. The two engineer regiments of the GOFG are fairly definitely believed to have remained there. Permanent structures have been built in some of the troop camps between AKEN and KUEHRAU. The completion of a training phase was also observed in the WITTENBERG area of the Third Gds Mecz Army in mid-July. The engineer units returned to WEISS ASSER, SPERENBERG and DESSAU during the second half of July, but the bridge building equipment was left at, and additional equipment was sent to, the training area in WITTENBERG. No new information was available on the ongineer units of the First Gds Mecz Arry which are still believed stationed in the area of LUEHLBERG.

Individual reports on transportation tended to indicate that the engineer units of the Second Gds Mecz Army which had practiced in the JERICHOW area on the Elbe River in June joined their divisions in the area of the armies in early July.

d. Area of RUEGEN Island.

The 4th Arty Brig (US) was still on RUEGEN Island in July. No landing protices were reported during July. Several units, probably the tank and AAA components involved in previous reported landing practices left the island in early July.

e. Area of ROSTOCK.

No reports on this area were received in July. As, however, a retransfer of troops to ALTENCRABCV would undoubtedly have been reported, the unidentified artillery brigade of the LXXIX Mtz Rifle Corps is still believed stationed in ROSTOCK.

f. ALTENBURG-ZEITZ Area.

The air landing practices were terminated during the first days of

g. Area between RATHENCT and STEEDAL.

On about 10 July, units of the Fourth Gds Mecz Army embarked upon a major exercise which proceeded in the direction of the Elbe River and toward the ARMEBURG-JEAICHON area. On about 10 July, about 15 trains were concentrated in the training area in addition to the troops with tanks, armored scout cars and AT guns and started returning to TELPLIN, LIEBEROSE, and EMERSWALLE from the area of JERICHON on 13 July. In conjunction with the engineer practices mentioned in paragraph c, the problem of the exercise may have been a counterattack against an enemy who had penetrated across the Elbe River from the west and was to be repelled. The exercise probably was completed on 12 July when bridgeheads were established by forces from the east. It could not be determined whether the units of the Third Shock Army and the Third Gds Lecz Army which, according to paragraph c, trained on the west bank of the river represented the enemy forces.

h. Area of FINSTERNALDE-DOBNILUGK.

A signal command post exercise began in the FINSTERWALDE-DOBRILUGK area on 12 July and was still under way on 30 July. Headquarters and signal units of the GOFG, the IV Arty Corps, the First and the Third Gds Mecz Army, the Eighth Gds Army and the air force participated. AAA units were also seen in the training area.

- 10. In July 1952, the operational situation of the East German railroads was wormal, although a heavy backlog of more than 1,000 undispatched railroad cars during the first weeks in July was indicative of operational difficulties. Available coal stocks decreased further. On 16 July, a quantity adequate for 12.8 days' operations was available whereas in June 14.3 days' requirements were available.
- 11. There was a slight increase in rail traffic across the border but it continued to be within normal limits. Special transportation operations were under way druing the reported period and included: the vehicle replacement program which started in February 1952; the rdation of personnel which began on about 15 July 1952; the shipment of individual tanks, guns and aircraft from the U.S.S.R. to Germany; and the grain shuttle train program under which a total of 2,102 boxcarloads of grain equivalent to 31,530 tons was shipped to Eastern Germany during the period from 1 to 30 June 1952. The grain shuttle train program is believed to be largely completed. The first trains of former German freight cars began to arrive in Eastern Germany from the U.S.S.R. in late June 1952 as part of the program under which another 20,000 freight cars were repurchased from the U.S.S.R.
- 12. Railroad construction efforts were concentrated on the construction of the KAROW-BINNENNERDER section of the Nordring BERLIN. It is not expected that this section will be completed earlier than 15 September 1952 because of a shortage of labor and building equipment. The second construction section which continues the line via EIRKENAETDER, HENNIGSDORF, FALKENSEE and JUSTELLARK and was originally planned for 1953 was to be started and completed by the second half of 1952. Other important construction projects included: the reconstruction of the second track between GUBEN and FALKENBERG; the reconstruction of the diamentled single track TEMPLIN PRENZLAD line and of the LISTZOW-BINZ line on RUEGEN Island; and the construction of 15 km of branch lines from VOGELSAND to BEBERSEE, and 8 km from SAGAND on RUEGEN Island northward. The first project is believed for Soviet requirements in the TEMPLIN troop training grounds area, while the second project is probably linked with the construction of a naval base at the Jaszunder Bodden.
- 13. In early July, all heavy-duty cars with a load capacity of 80 tons were removed from the 15 tank shuttle trains permanently available for the Russians in Eastern Germany. Reports tended to indicate that they will be replaced by a new modern type which has the designation RFyms. Although this six-axle car also has a load capacity of 80 tons, it has a capacity of two tanks because it is 18 meters long and, thus, is more useful than the previous type which was capable of carrying only one tank.

Supply Situation.

14. Available information on the supply situation indicated that the motor vehicle replacement program was continued in June and during the first half of July and the VP continued receiving heavy weapons and equipment. Up to 12 July, about 7,136 new motor vehicles had arrived in Eastern Germany from the U.S.S.R. since the beginning of 1952, and about 4,600_{|LLEGIB} old vehicles had been sent back to the U.S.S.R. Previous observations indicated that the arrival in Eastern Germany of 1,000 cars carrying williary supply goods from the U.S.S.R. was the monthly normal.

recently been learned that this norm was considerably exceeded in May 1952 when 3,058 cars including 1,926 cars carrying motor vehicles arrived. A total of 2,015 cars including 1,497 cars with motor vehicles and 123 cars with tanks for the VP were counted in June. It was noted that only 85 cars carrying ammunition were observed in June as compared with 569 cars in May, 383 cars in April, 133 cars in Earch and 303 cars in February. Up to 12 July, reports indicated that motor vehicles continued arriving at the previous rate. Military supply traffic in Eastern Germany also increased as a result of the motor vehicle replacement program. Also, there was an increased supply traffic between post and troop training grounds.

15. The former German ammunition depot in KOENIGSTAEDT in the area of GRANSEE was apparently reconditioned for use as a Soviet ammunition depot. The fuel depot in BLESENTHAL which is believed to be assigned to the Fourth Gds Lecz Army was apparently completed. The construction work on a new large fuel depot with a capacity of about 5,000 cubic meters was continued in MEXDORF, 20 km southwest of FRANKFURT/Oder.

German Volkspolizei.

16. Tanks continued to arrive for the cadre units of the VP. As far as could be determined, 123 T-34 tanks were shipped from the U.S.S.R. to 22 of the 24 VPDs. An estimated 200 tanks were available to the military units of the VP in mid-July 1952. Each of the VPDs thus had one tank company equipped with 7 to 10 tanks. The recruiting campaign became more successful in July. The strengths of the cadre units is already believed to average more than 3,000 persons. This number was substantially exceeded in certain cases. The total strength of the HVA including military schools is believed to approximate 100,000 soldiers to date. Some of the recruits enlisted with the NVA units were detached to the sea police, the air police and the border police. No accurate information on the number of these recruits is available. preparations for the establishment of a Ministry of National Defense were under way. The group in charge of these preparations was said to be located in the building of the Interior Ministry on Glinka Strasse in BERLIN.

18. No complete units were transferred to troop training grounds in July 1952. The training activity observed did not exceed battalion level. In late June and early July in the area south of VIENNA, the 13th Gds Mecz Div conducted a headquarters and signal command post exercise which chiefly involved headquarters of the mechanized units and tank units of this division. Artillery units, AT units and tank units of the 13th Gds Mecz Div were transported by rail to the DOELLERSHEIL troop training grounds. The 8th Gds Engr Bn of the 13th Gds Mecz Div returned to is post in ALOSTERNEUBURG from an engineer training site in the area of TULLN in mid-huly.
