Deportations 25X1 3. The largest deportations in Latvia were in March 1919, but only one person a kulak, was deported from Vitini at that time. One member of the family

had been deported. The family received a letter
in April 1951 from an MTS station in Omsk saying that it was extremely
cold, that no heat was provided in the bare buts in which the deportees lived, 25X1 25X1 and that food was scarce and bad. It is permitted to send and receive letters 25X1 and packages from the deportees but not to visit them. 25X1	7.	The village of Vitini is divided into two kolkhozy consisting of 40 houses each. The houses are separate at present, but the Soviets planned to build central apartments and offices for the kolkhozy and destroy or move the scattered houses.				
25X1	8.	No Russians worked in the kolkhozy in Vitini, although the majority of the workers in nearby sovkhozy were Russian. Many Russians worked in the mill in Auce, because it served as a control point for Latvians submitting the required				
25/(1		amount of grain to the state and provided a good opportunity for graft. In addition to the mill, Auce's main industry is a wool factory. It also has an				
25X1		MTS station and a hospital with one Latvian doctor and two nurses. medical care and hospitalization were free, but not medicine.
