THIS IS UNEVALUATED INFORMATION

1. On 13 August the headquarters of the Chinese Communist 38 Army was in a series of shelters at the southern foot of Hill 535 at approximately 127-01, 38-29 (CT-278621).
2. Attached to this headquarters was a large supply depot.¹ Sixty to eighty trucks were used to transport supplies to the depot. Rice, corn, and sorghum were stored on the side of the hill in about 130 piles covered with tents between 20 and 30 meters long, 3 hemp bags wide, and 15 hemp bags high. Arms and ammunition were unloaded in shelters at the foot of the hill. About 20 trucks transported the supplies to the front at night through Oktong-ni (127-07, 38-27) (CT-3657) and P'yongyang (CT-5251). Some of these supplies were stored temporarily beneath a bridge which crossed the stream about one kilometer from Oktong-ni.²

1. Comment. A directive from MAO Tse-tung had specified that all Chinese Communist armies maintain a three-months reserve of supplies on hand.
