The locations described in the following report are indicated on Enclosure (A), "Pinpoint Location of Antiaircraft Artillery Sites in the Stalin (Brasov) Area".

Point #1

The site, located across the highway from the western boundary of the airfield, is on a plot of ground formerly used as a garden. Five guns are located in this area; the platforms of each are imbedded in the ground. [ ] the gun barrels pointing in a north-south direction (0 to 180 degrees) and on occasion [ ] the traverse of the guns to be 90 to 180 degrees. [ ] the barrels elevated at various degrees, from level to almost perpendicular.

Each gun is equipped with one barrel, and the guns are dug into the ground.

the guns are arranged in a triangular pattern. estimate the distance between guns at 10 meters.

saw personnel using equipment believed to be a small type range finder, along the eastern boundary approximately 25-30 meters from the guns. This range finder is tubular in shape, approximately one meter in length, and is operated from a sitting position. The site is accessible by the Stalin Sanpetru highway (4543N-2538E).

Point #2 This site, located within the boundary of Stalin Airfield, consists of three guns in triangular arrangement. (They are smaller than those described in

25X1 Point #1 [redacted] This site was observed during the summer of 1951. In the early fall, a fence was constructed on the airfield, separating the factory area and gun site from the landing field;

25X1 Each gun is equipped with one barrel.

25X1 [redacted] the distance between guns to be from 6 to 10 meters.

25X1 [redacted] saw one searchlight, approximately 1.5 meters in diameter, at various distances from the guns [redacted] 25X1

25X1 Point #3 [redacted] the approximate location indicated as Point #3 of Enclosure (A) [redacted]

25X1 Point #4 [redacted] 25X1 location as indicated on Enclosure (A) On clear days, the abrupt 400 meter hill known as Tampa Hill (the name of Stalin is printed in a growth of new trees on the top of the hill) is clearly visible from Strada Principala, (Main Street) near the southern boundary of the city of Stalin, and it is possible to see men and one gun located on the top.

25X1 [redacted] saw one gun at the top of this hill.

25X1 Point #5 [redacted] three or four beams of antiaircraft searchlights coming from this area at night. [redacted] 25X1

25X1 Point #6 [redacted] this site to be an antiaircraft position [redacted] saw antiaircraft personnel in and about the area. [redacted] saw no antiaircraft equipment at any time.

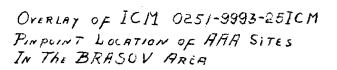
25X1 Point #7 During the early months of 1952 [redacted] antiaircraft personnel in this area. It was general knowledge among the personnel at Stalin Airfield that an antiaircraft site was located in the area. [redacted] 25X1

25X1 Point #8 [redacted] operation of searchlights atop the hill.

25X1 Point #9 [redacted] The area contains antiaircraft guns, the number [redacted] cannot estimate. At the time of the flights over and near the area, [redacted] guns were in the area outlined on the enclosure and were used in conjunction with the Officers' Artillery School immediately south of this area.
