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1. An important military conference was to take place at Prague between 3 and 5 January 1953. It was to be presided over by Minister of Defense Alexander Šepiška, who will be assisted by generals Hruška, Kratochvíl and Thor.
2. The conference was to be concerned with political education in the army, the organization of passive defense, and the production of arms for China.
3. As a result of criticisms of political indifference in the army, made on 23 September and 6 December 1952 by the Soviet Military Mission, political education will be watched over by Soviet officers at the battalion level. Knowledge of the Russian language will become obligatory for the promotion of Czechoslovak officers. Czechoslovak officers charged with political education at the company level will be sent to the USSR in groups for a period of three to six months.
4. From 15 January 1953 on, the organization of passive defense is to be accelerated throughout the country under the direction of a special commission, Chamber, presided over by Oldřich Burda, who will be assisted by Dr. Klinger, Vodička and Ševc. Brigadier-General Oskar Jelen, who was responsible for political education in the army down to June 1952 and who became a member of the Chamber (sic) after his resignation from the first post, will be charged with the technical organization of passive defense. Participation will be obligatory for the entire population.
5. The production of arms for China is to be centralized. The Zbrojovka factory at Brno in southwest Bohemia will be placed completely at the disposition of the Chinese Military Mission. The factory specializes in the manufacture of flame-throwers.
6. It was expected that Soviet officers would also take part in the conference and that they would use the occasion to announce the formation of three new Czechoslovak divisions, and the reorganization of the 4 and 5 Corps.

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
