Nomination of Mr. Robert W. Gambino for the National Intelligence Medal

of Achievement

1. Mr. Robert W. Gambino has been unanimously recommended by members of the Security Committee for award of the National Intelligence Medal of Achievement for exceptional service as Chairman of the Director of Central Intelligence Security Committee from March 1978 to February 1980. Mr. Gambino's outstanding service in that capacity clearly benefited the security of the United States and contributed greatly to the foreign intelligence mission of the Intelligence Community.

2. Mr. Gambino devised and implemented a plan for the reorganization of the DCI Security Committee to enlarge its supporting staff and enhance its coordination capabilities so as to permit a concerted attack on many long-standing security problems of Intelligence Community concern. As chairman of the reorganized committee, he managed, coordinated and furthered the development of Community-wide security policies and procedures which provided better protection for intelligence sources and methods while improving the dissemination and use of intelligence information. Mr. Gambino's leadership and initiative significantly enhanced the effectiveness of

the committee as a Community oriented body for the identification of issues, the resolution of individual agency views, and the development of constructive solutions to a wide range of security concerns. The close working relationships he built with officers throughout the Community ensured open communication and better understanding of how security issues individually affected component agencies, and facilitated agreement toward how best to deal with those issues in practical and acceptable ways.

- Mr. Gambino provided continuing and wide-ranging support to the DCI and the Community for the review and analysis of both specific problems and basic concepts bearing on the protection of sensitive intelligence. His leadership and direction contributed directly to an enhanced sense of Community purpose and cohesiveness in the coordination and development of a Community examination of specific technical security threats directed against the United States; of a wide-ranging security plan for a particularly significant overseas facility; of procedures to ensure greater consistency in the Community's handling of personnel security adjudications; of guidance for the analysis, investigation and follow-up of unauthorized disclosures so that issues and options are clearly identified and dealt with; and of policies and implementation procedures for a coherent system of compartmentation to assure protection of sensitive intelligence sources and methods while facilitating the use and administrative handling of information they provide.
- 4. Mr. Gambino's exceptional breadth of knowledge of the concerns and capabilities of Community departments and agencies made him singularly effective in assessing the impact on the DCI's responsibilities of broad ranging security proposals and in suggesting changes to them so as to serve best the needs and concerns of the Intelligence Community as a whole. His accomplishments included overseeing the preparation of Community standards and briefing kits to enhance security awareness by both senior and working level personnel; the development of a broader and

mutually supportive security research and development program; the drafting of security standards to protect information covered by the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act; and the conduct of a zero-based review of Community accesses to sensitive compartmented information. The skills he brought to bear on these and many other issues were invaluable in threading a balanced course between differing subjective views on the one hand and statutory, executive order and national policy requirements bearing on the DCI's security responsibilities on the other.

- 5. Mr. Gambino's skills in negotiation and communication contributed materially to good security rapport with the most senior levels of Community management and with Congressional oversight committees. His career serves as an exemplary model for intelligence managers, and his record of smoothly completed and markedly useful accomplishments has brought great credit upon himself and the Intelligence Community. That record, with his never failing courtesy, ability to defuse controversies with good humor and tact, and consideration for others, have caused him to be held in the highest regard by all who have been so fortunate as to work with him.
