2. The tank farm on the west side of the port is used for harbor storage and the separate companies rent the tanks from the port authorities. There are about 70 tanks, uniform size and design, with a concrete wall around each one. About four or five tanks have been destroyed. Approximate capacity of each tank is 10,000 tons. Pipe lines lead from the harbor storage tanks to the petroleum docks. Gasoline lines are carried on gantries approximately seven feet above ground. Fuel pipes are underground. There are six loading points on the petroleum docks, four with ten connections and two with eight. Not all of these connections are in working order. There are four bunker tanks serving the passenger wharf on the north side of the harbor. These have underground pipe lines connecting them to the wharf.
