Introductory Comment

1. Nationalist military arsenals captured by the Communists include the following: No. 11, Chuchou (113-06, 27-53); No. 90, Mukden, whose estimated capacity was reduced 80 percent by Soviet removals of equipment, machinery and supplies; No. 44, Tsinan; No. 61, Shanghai; No. 30, Wuchang (114-17, 30-32); No. 70, Peiping; No. 60, Nanking; the group at Taiyuan (112-35, 37-52); and No. 26, Hanyang (114-14, 30-31)*****.

Capture of the arsenals solved the Communists' major production problems because the condition, production and products of these arsenals were vastly better than those of the small-scale factories previously possessed by the Communists. This report gives details of the production of each arsenal before capture.

3. It is estimated that at one time the Communists had some 400 armament factories. The equipment of a good many was crude owing to the shortage of buildings, machine tools and technicians. Many factories existed only to fill local daily needs, and were moved from place to place. After the major Nationalist arsenals were captured by the Communists, the value of small factories diminished. Several were closed, others were moved, and some were combined. Because of this, it has been impossible to avoid including some obsolete material in this compilation, as well as some duplication of information.

4. The following tables were compiled from data collected before November 1948, and

[REDACTED] arsenals have not been included. An attempt has been made to include only that material which is reliable and up-to-date. However, no production details are known after Communist occupation of the arsenals; it is likely that they have increased production during the past year (1949). It is probable that, in some cases, capacities as given vary somewhat from actual production.

This shop undertook repairs of all types of small arms and the production of all types of shells and munitions. Its monthly capacity is unknown.
19. Chin Hing Industrial Machine Shop
Situating in Hsien Chien Street, Taiyuan
This shop undertook manufacture of trench mortars, LMGs, HMGs, light artillery pieces, and all types of shells. No capacity figures are available.

All equipment and machinery belonging to the establishments numbered 10 to 19 above were lost to the Communists.

e. One arsenal converted from a former alcohol manufacturing plant situated in Tai Ping Chiao, Harbin. 300 workmen, of whom 20 were Japanese and Korean.

Located near Hunchun (130-21, 42-52). The exact number of workmen unknown, but some 100 Japanese are included.

Located in the southern outskirts of Yenchi (129-31, 42-53). 2,000 workmen, of whom more than half were Japanese. It can manufacture mountain pieces, HMGs, and rifles. It is one of the two largest arsenals in eastern Manchuria.

Located on the hill to the south of East Railway Station at Tumen (129-49, 42-58). 2,000 workmen.

6. Hokiang Province.

a. Chi Hsi Arsenal ✓

Located in the area to the west of Tungan (121-51, 45-33). 5,000 workmen. Established December 1946, it was the largest Communist arsenal in Manchuria.

Located on the hill five li north of Chihsai (130-58, 45-18). 1,000 workmen, of whom 300 were Japanese.

Located at Mei Erh Keng (unlocated) to the north of Tsitsihar (123-57, 47-20). 1,700 workmen. Well-equipped, it could undertake the manufacture of machine guns and rifles.

8. Nunkiang Province.

Tsitsihar Arsenal

Located at Tsitsihar. The director of this arsenal was CHAO Wen. No details on production are available.

9. Jehol Province.

a. One arsenal located in the premises of the local prison at Kailu (121-12, 43-35), with branches in the premises of the Chi Shou administrator's building.

11. Hopei Province.

a. One arsenal located on Yansen Street, Hsi Cu (unlocated) village near Tseching Kuan (unlocated), to the west of Hsien (115-29, 39-21). 1,600 workmen, of whom 1,000 were Japanese. Rifles, artillery shells, small-arms ammunition, land mines, and small-caliber artillery pieces were manufactured here, but exact production figures are not known.

b. One arsenal located at Pei Wa (unlocated) village, twenty li northwest of Wuchianghsien (115-51, 38-10). 1,000 workmen, of whom twenty were Japanese. The director of the arsenal was MA Wen-yao.

This arsenal was moved from Kuantai (114-05, 36-16), Iowa Province. It had an electric power plant; it could manufacture trench mortars, and grenade dischargers. The plant was established at Lucheng in 1947.

d. New China Company

Located in Ping Cheng Chen, Lingcuan (113-25, 35-43). It had 1,000 workmen and new machinery. It manufactured No. 38 trench mortars*.

e. One arsenal located at Wei Tiao Tsun, 60 li northwest of Chincheng (112-56, 35-31). 2,000 workmen, among them were a number of Japanese technicians. It could manufacture No. 38 rifles* as well as explosives.

f. One arsenal located at Wei Tiao (unlocated), 40 li north of Chincheng. 2,000 workmen. This arsenal was being enlarged. It could manufacture light machine guns, rifles, and pistols.

g. An artillery ammunition factory located at Nan Shih Tsao, five li outside the East Gate of Changchih (112-4, 36-05). 2,400 workmen. HUANG Tin-kuo was the director of this factory. It could manufacture trench mortar bombs at a daily rate of about a hundred boxes.

- b. A hand grenade factory at Pa Kiu in Miao, 30 li east of Mengying (117-59, 35-45). 2,000 workmen, who produced 30,000 hand grenades daily.
- c. One arsenal 60 kilometers southwest of Tansiaokotou, Mouping (121-37, 37-24). 1,300 workmen. It could produce heavy trench mortars and howitzers, and was experimenting with bazookas.
- d. Arsenal located at the northeast corner of Nanchen (116-14, 36-45), northeast of Hsinshui (unlocated). 1,000 workmen. Produced artillery shells and land mines. It also undertook repairs.
- e. An arsenal located at Wenteng (121-03, 37-12), and its immediate vicinity. 1,900 workers. Produced rifles, tommyguns, and grenade dischargers.
- f. One arsenal located at southeast corner of Mingtien, Lunan (unlocated). Used 2,000 workmen and produced 400 artillery shells daily.

14. Honan Province

- a. An arsenal located at Hsi Ta Tsun (unlocated), 45 li east of Shehsien (113-50, 36-38). 5,000 worker. It used waterpower from the Chang river, but production is not known.
- b. A chemical works in Ho Tsun Hsueh, Kuan (114-16, 36-44). Besides producing 1,000 cattles of sulfuric explosives daily, its 1,200 workers turned out rifles, land mines, and hand grenades.
- c. One arsenal located at Tung Tsun (unlocated), 18 li northwest of Shehsien. Equipped with a hydroelectric power plant, it employed 1,800 workers. It produced 2,000 rounds small-arms ammunition and 1,000 hand grenades daily; and 50 rifles, 8 trench mortars, and 7 light machine guns weekly.

- a. No. 75 rifle Probably a Chinese imitation of the German 7.5mm Mauser bolt-action military rifle.
- b. No. 41 75mm mountain gun Probably an imitation of the Japanese Model 41 (1908) 75mm infantry gun, which was originally the standard Japanese pack artillery weapon.
- c. 50mm mortar Probably an imitation of the Japanese Model 98 (1938) 50mm trench mortar.
