REVISIONS IN THE 1951 PRODUCTION PLAN FOR FERROUS METALS

Plan

the 1951 planned production of raw steel in the GDR amounted to 1,384,000 tons, whereas the Statistical Central Office was using the corrected figure of 1,327,000 tons.

the new production plan figure was 1,327,000 tons. However, the Ministry of Heavy Industry requests that further official confirmation of this plan change by the State Planning Commission be sent to it and to the SKK (Soviet Control Commission), so as to eliminate any discrepancies in the 1951 production plan figure.

Because the GDR foundries were inadequately supplied with foundry pig iron, due to the great decrease in imports, it was decided on 15 April 1951 to change the production plans of the foundries. list of the changes (reductions in all cases) a) category and types of iron and steel products; b) confirmed plan figures (in tons); c) new plan figures (in tons). For example: a) raw steel, including Thomas steel, Siemens-Martin steel, and electric steel; b) 1,384,000 tons of raw steel, including 250,000 tons of Thomas steel, 1,074,000 tons of Siemens-Martin steel, and 60,000 tons of electric steel; c) 1,327,000 tons of raw steel, including 170,000 tons of Thomas steel, 1,100,000 tons of Siemens-Martin steel, and 57,000 tons of electric steel.
