THE SLOW PROGRESS OF THE SOVIETIZATION OF CZECHOSLOVAK AMATEUR RADIO

The leading editorial in this issue summed up the results of last years work in Czechoslovak Amateur Radio. In a typically Communist presentation the editorial stated that the transition from individualist ham work to activities in so called collective radio stations continued "throughout last year (52) more extensively than ever before," and added the usual propaganda—wise percentages of this progress. It declared that during 1952 the number of basic smateur local groups, and sws sympathizer's circles, increased supproximately, by 110 per cent. At the same time the membership basis, was considerably extended, and the rooster of new members recruited from the labor and the student groups increased by 120 per centin comparison with 1951.

The editorial complained however about the faults of the administrative and organizational work, It said: "One of our greatest faults wascur inability to arouse interest in collective amateur work among those who are either active hams or interested in Amateur dadio. There still are among us hams too many, who do not comprehend the political aims of collective ham work, and who do not lend aid in the fulfilment of these aims. The absence of our advanced hams and pofessionals in the collective work have caused, for example, the failure of our publication plans. Even now there are many capable hams standing alor of our collective work, excusing themselves by the lack of available spare time for this activity. These individuals isolate themselves and form a class of "advanced hams." Discussing the results of collective stations work, the editorial stated that those results were usually the work of a "few activists." There were no fixed or even preliminary plans, no equal distribution of tasks and duties among the operators and members of these collective ham stations.

As far as this years plans are dencerned, the editorial noted, the parent organization of Czech Amateurs, the SVAZARM will organize several special courses an various fields of elect romics. There will be courses for radio repairmen, sw. specialists, broadcast and television technicians, etc. Radio clubs will be established for hams locally, and to each supporting organization of the SVAZARM, a special communications group of 3 to 10 radioamateurs—hams preferrably—will be assigned for duty. The main purpose of all radio training, concluded the editorial, will be the creation of politically and technically reliable cadres, which will aid our army, our industries and other branches of our activities, through which we are building up our Socialist system and the defences of world peace.
