OPERATIONS

✓ 1. FAID's Far East coverage and processing capabilities were closely concentrated on the Taiwan crisis during the month. Monitored flashes on the cease-fire and its cancellation were communicated to Washington at speeds approaching the ten-minute CRITIC objective. In the latter case, the DCI was in a position to alert the President and Secretary of State well before the information was available in Washington from any other source. The Division received a commendation from the DCI for the "selectivity, good judgment and speed" displayed in the handling of the cease-fire announcement of October 5.

2. Efforts to recruit a Kurdish monitor have been intensified. Contacts have been initiated through CO with [redacted] and with Justice Douglass. Through the Contact Division, lines have been put out to universities and oriental societies. An Agency contract agent has been tested. The London Bureau is interviewing candidates procured through advertising. Following a renewed request to the Department of State, several prospects have been referred to the Mediterranean Bureau from the Embassy in Tehran. The Bureau Chief Monitor will proceed to Tehran in November to test these prospects and also to recruit one or more Persian monitors.

3. The Indonesian monitor recruit at the Saigon Bureau resigned for personal reasons shortly after EOD and returned to Singapore after reimbursement of U.S. Government expenses. The Saigon, Tokyo and Okinawa Bureaus have initiated new recruiting efforts.

4. A draft of terms under which an FAID operation in Accra could be proposed by the Embassy to the Government of Ghana was submitted to the Department of State.

5. The approved Television Monitoring Staff Study was disseminated through the USIB community and USIA, along with invitations to attend a conference on 20 November to discuss possible requirements and general TV monitoring problems.

6. The Chief, Tokyo Bureau, reported he had learned informally that the local Signal Officer was recommending to Washington the discontinuance of the FAIS trans-Pacific allocated communications channel. It was said to have felt that support of the complex FAIS line system was placing too great a burden on his resources. Upon advice of the AD/O, a commendation of the Army Chief Signal Officer and his Communications Agency was prepared for signature of the DDCI. Addressed to the Army Chief-of-Staff, it cites the unparalleled benefits to the intelligence community accruing from the FAIS allocated channel system.

7. PRIS supported and participated in the drafting of a revised Charter for the Inter-Office Telecommunications Advisory Committee which broadens its mission in the telecommunications field. It is felt that the new charter, if approved by the DD/I, DD/P and D/C, will enhance the usefulness of the Committee, particularly to participants such as OO, who have little current concern with the electromagnetic warfare and U.S. international broadcasting problems.

✓ 8. The practice of labeling material from Soviet and Communist Chinese regional transmitters as OFFICIAL USE ONLY has been discontinued as of 27 October. The bulk of this material will continue to be published in the OFFICIAL USE ONLY volumes but will bear the designation (UNCLASSIFIED).

✓ 9. The Executive Secretariat of the Department of State and the Office of the Joint Chiefs of Staff were added as recipients of the PRIS Wire on 14 and 21 October, respectively.

✓ 10. At the request of the PP Staff of DD/P, the PRIS Wire serviced ten separate requests involving 18 items under the authority of "Spotlight Commentary."

- b. "Soviet Broadcasts To and About the Kurds," prompted by informal queries from the State Department. State OIRA had originally been asked for information on the subject by several U.S. Embassies. Copies of the report were sent to the Embassies in Baghdad, Cairo, Damascus and Moscow.

14. Special Propaganda Analysis Services:
- a. Seventeen analyses of Soviet and Chinese Communist propaganda on the Taiwan Strait crisis were disseminated on the FBID Wire as part of FBID's continuing special analysis support of State Department, OCB, and OCI. State OIRA/IRP continued to rely on these analyses in the preparation of cabled reviews of Communist propaganda for Ambassador Beck in Warsaw.
  - b. Additional propaganda-analysis items on the Wire included eight on the Soviet resumption of nuclear testing and Soviet comment on the Geneva nuclear test ban talks; a report on Khrushchev's rejection of Soviet cooperation with the West in assisting underdeveloped countries, a contradiction of the prior Soviet position; background on a new Khrushchev forecast of the "destruction of capitalism" in the event of war; and highlights of the USSR's October Revolution anniversary slogans.
  - c. A study of "Propaganda Indications of Soviet Preparations for Hostilities" was prepared at the request of the Indications Control Officer, OCI, in support of a coordinated Agency study for the Deputy Director, CIA. The objective of the study was to assemble and weigh all evidence relevant to a Watch Committee conclusion that the USSR was making no active moves toward carrying out its commitment to Communist China in the Taiwan Strait crisis. FBID's contribution occasioned a complimentary letter from the Assistant Director for Current Intelligence.
  - d. Propaganda-analysis support of the U.S. delegation at the Geneva nuclear test ban talks began on 31 October. Initial Soviet propaganda treatment of the talks was summed up in an FBID contribution to OCI's daily support cable for the delegation. Texts of key Soviet propaganda materials are being supplied to the delegation by the London Bureau.

- e. Report No. 3 on Soviet broadcast exploitation of U.S. press sources was issued in response to the Director's request for monthly reporting on the subject.

**✓ 15. Other Special Services Rendered by FBID:**

- a. A special service performed for the DCI during the Taiwan crisis was the procurement of the Chinese text of the statement made by CCP Defense Minister Peng Te-huai on October 5. The Okinawa Bureau converted the Chinese Hollerith version into numerical code, which was then reconverted to Chinese characters by FID and was on the DCI's desk by 0900 EDT 6 October.
- b. A detailed unclassified report listing all broadcasting operations in Mexico was prepared for transmittal to the Ray Mcnelly Company at the request of the Contacts Division.

**FACILITIES**

16. A preliminary inspection has been made of a possible emergency relocation site for FBID headquarters and relocation site for the East Coast Bureau at the [redacted] West Virginia area. This was followed by a discussion with Army Signals personnel responsible for planning OCOM as well as other Executive Agency communications requirements.

17. After minor deficiencies had caused a delay, the new Kokomo Bureau operations building and antenna field have now been accepted from the contractor. They have been in use since 14 September.

18. Agreement was reached with Operations Division, Office of Communications for incorporation of the FBIS German Bureau file into tests of the new 1600 words per minute speed AS-4 to be activated experimentally early next year at Frankfurt. Arrangements were coordinated with the Chief, German Bureau, during his TDY here. Regular ACAN service will continue without interruption during the test, enabling performance comparisons to be made.

**ADMINISTRATION**

19. Budget allocations were forwarded to the field bureaus on 3 October.

20. A study was forwarded to the Assistant Director for Operations containing details and effects of a reduction in the Division I/G of two persons, and several alternative methods for further reductions of two and five percent.

21. During October, four employees entered on duty and three were separated. On duty strength as of 31 October was [redacted] including two employees on LWOP, one employee detailed to FE and two employees assigned from clerical pool not to be counted against FBID ceiling.
