Liason with 0/S0

I think it may be of some interest to Dr. Langer that 0/SO, according to my own experience, is dissatisfied with the fact that it is from time to time requested to assist 0/NE in the preparation of its estimates.

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On 1 May during the preparation of a memorandum on the Irantan situation for the NSC, and on the instructions of Dr. Langer that I obtain the views of other CIA office s, I went to Dr. in O/SO. 25X1A9a Although Dr. allowed me to confer with O/SO's Iranian specialists, he did so with very poor grace. During my conversation with him he indicated that:

(a) 0/S0 was being overburdened with requests from 0/NE.

- (b) O/SO personnel were not paid to "estimate", but to produce facts.
- (c) 0/S0 personnel had more than they could do to keep up with their own jobs, and didn't have time to help 0/NE to do its job.

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Ir. who was also present in Dr. office, added comments to the same effect. Dr. also objected to the fact that earlier in the day I had attempted (although unsuccessfully) to get into direct

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in the day I had attempted (although unsuccessfully) to get into direct touch with Mr. head of the Near Eastern division, when I was unable to get hold of him When I explained that, so far as I was aware, I was simply going through a procedure which had been in effect for several years between O/RE and O/SO, Dr. claimed 25X1A9a that that was quite a different situation. He stated that he was going to get in touch with Dr. Langer and to discuss the matter.

I should like to add that the Iranian specialists whom I eventually saw were most helpful and cordial and offered to assist us whenever we thought they could do so.

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
