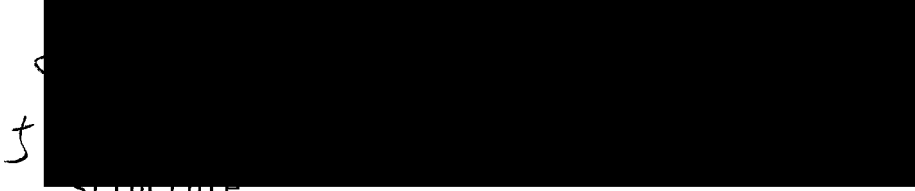

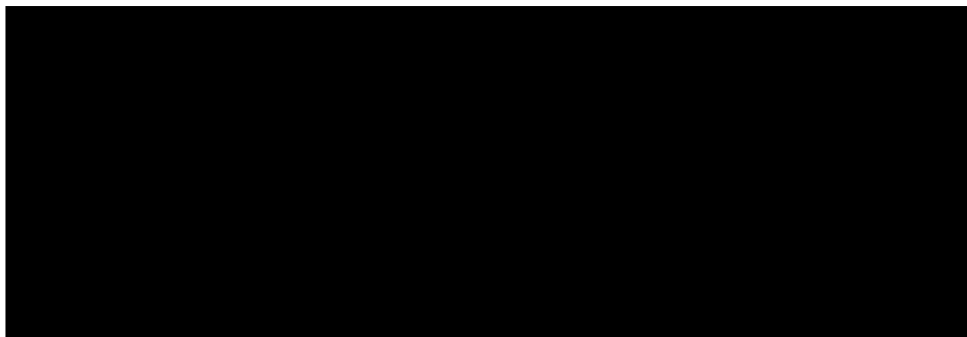

(2) Equipment Loans

Occasionally (approximately 6 - 12 times each year) TSD receives a request for loan of equipment. Again the requests are from USIB agencies, and equipment is normally requested for a specific purpose and duration. Recent examples of equipment loan are the following:

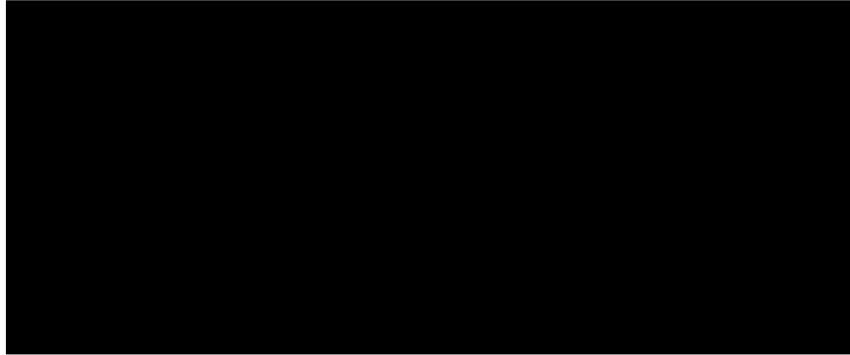

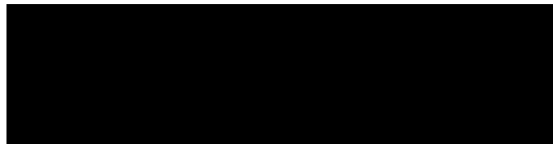
