

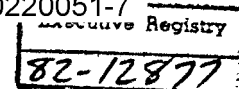

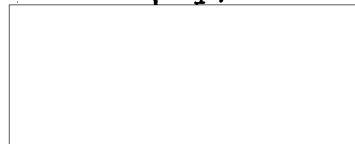
I wish to extend to you an invitation to meet for lunch with the Editorial Board of The Washington Times.
