
The Committee on Science and Technology has jurisdictional responsibility within the House of Representatives for space science research and development. Soviet efforts in space science, as well as those in China and Eastern European countries, are of particular concern. The Committee's interest includes such subjects as manned space programs, possible development of manned reusable space vehicles, laser research, military use of space stations, communications and other satellite applications.

Ms. Marcia S. Smith, an employee of the Congressional Research Service, Library of Congress, for the last seven years, is the single specialist assigned by a legislative support agency to provide this Committee with analytical support in this area. Therefore, I would request your assistance in expediting the investigative work required to grant Ms. Smith access to compartmented information requiring SI, TK, and BYC clearances. I have also requested the support of Dr. George A. Keyworth, Director, Office of Science and Technology Policy in securing these clearances for Ms. Smith.

Your assistance would also be appreciated in arranging facilities, either at your agency, NASA, DIA, or the Executive Office of the President, where Ms. Smith can study appropriate documents or receive briefings as necessary. Such an arrangement will assure maximum control of documents without the need to transfer material either to the Committee or to CRS.

Dear Dry Bestorth:

As you know the Committee on Science and Technology has jurisdictional and oversight responsibility within the House of Representatives in the area of space science research and development. This subject is of increasing importance as speculation continues regarding Soviet research on lasers for space applications, new space monitoring and communication systems, increasing capability for satellite weapons research, and other aspects of the Soviet space science program. We are particularly concerned about potential Soviet development of a reusable manned space vehicle, perhaps similar to the U.S. space shuttle, which may have military applications. Space research activity in China and Eastern European countries is also of great interest.

Ms. Marcia S. Smith, an employee of the Congressional Research Service Science Policy Research Division, Library of Congress, for the past seven years, is the specialist in space systems assigned by that organization to provide assistance to this Committee on the topics discussed above. In order for Ms. Smith to provide objective analyses, I believe it is necessary for her to have access to special compartmented information which requires SI, TK, and BYC clearances.

I would like to request your assistance in securing expedited approval of these special access clearances. Ms. Smith currently holds a Top Secret security clearance granted April 19, 1976, by the Library of Congress on the basis of a full field investigation completed by the former U.S. Civil Service Commission on March 19, 1976. She was granted a "Q" clearance by the Department of Energy on May 19, 1980, on the basis of the aforementioned Civil Service Commission investigation and an updated National Agency Check completed March 31, 1980. I would very much appreciate it if you would request, on our behalf that the FBI conduct the additional background investigation necessary to permit her access to this information. The documents required by the FBI are enclosed.

Enclosed is a copy of a letter to the CIA in which I have asked that Ms. Smith be provided access to office space either at your agency, NASA, DIA, or HQ, CIA to eliminate the need for transferring material either to the Committee or to CRS.
