I nominate Dr. R. J. Smith, Deputy Director for Intelligence in the Central Intelligence Agency, for the thirteenth annual Career Service Award.

Dr. Smith is a brilliant intelligence expert whose outstanding competence is clearly recognized both in the United States intelligence community and abroad. He was our nominee for the 1966 Career Service Award. He has continued to make major contributions to the success of the Agency's mission to provide intelligence affecting the national security to the President and the National Security Council. In the past year he has attained even greater stature at the national level as a result of his appointment as head of the Agency's Intelligence Directorate -- the overt intelligence collection and the intelligence production side of CIA. In his direction of this most vital element in the structure of our Government, Dr. Smith has demonstrated that he is an outstanding Federal career executive. His round-the-clock analyses of complicated international situations for the President and his principal advisers have been commended often in the past year.
