MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Central Intelligence

SUBJECT : 1966 Federal Woman's Award

1. This memorandum submits for your signature a letter and a document nominating Miss [redacted] for the sixth annual Federal Woman's Award.

2. The attached letter from Mrs. Katie Louchheim, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, invites the Agency to nominate candidates for the 1966 Federal Woman's Award. The previous recipients of these awards have been outstanding women whose careers represent remarkable achievements in domestic or international fields of Government service.



3. Miss [redacted], a research analyst in OCI, was named by the Deputy Director for Intelligence as a candidate for the 1966 Woman's Award and the Honor and Merit Awards Board recommended that she be selected as the Agency's candidate this year.

4. The document nominating Miss [redacted] was prepared by a representative of the Office of Current Intelligence and a member of this Office. Due to security considerations and the sensitivity of the Vietnam situation, we could not elaborate on the specific achievements of our candidate. For this reason it is recommended that you suggest that a representative of the Agency brief the Board of Trustees for the Federal Woman's Award if they desire more information concerning her achievements.

5. The nominating documents have been reviewed and concurred in by Mr. [redacted] on behalf of the Deputy Director for Intelligence, and by a representative of the Office of Security. The closing date for receipt of nominations is 26 October 1965.

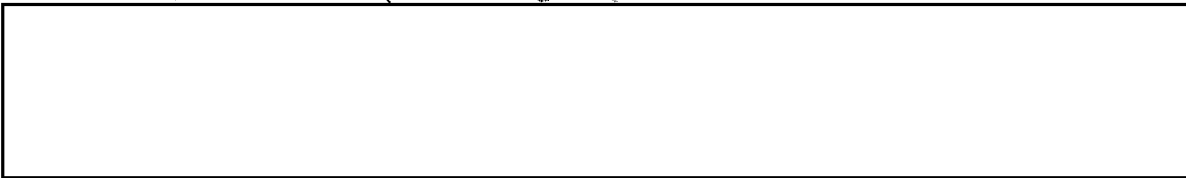

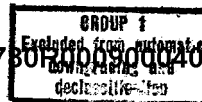

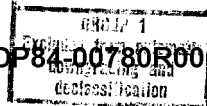

## 6. FEDERAL WOMAN'S AWARDS

These awards are granted annually by the Federal Woman's Awards Board of Trustees, which is a group of outstanding community leaders and top level Federal officials. The Federal Woman's Awards are granted to provide special recognition to women who have made outstanding contributions to the efficiency and quality of the career service of the Federal Government, to encourage high standards of performance from other women in Government, and to dramatize and make more widely known to the public the wide variety and satisfaction of careers for women in the service of the Federal Government. Each year a number of awards, not to exceed six, are granted. Recipients receive medals and commemorative gifts at the Federal Woman's Award Banquet held in Washington, D. C.

### a. BASIS FOR AWARDS

The following general criteria are used in selecting nominees:

- (1) Career service which has been characterized by outstanding ability and achievement in an executive, professional, scientific, or technical position.
- (2) Achievements having an important effect on a major Government program.
- (3) Specific outstanding accomplishments which have made or are making an important contribution to administrative, social, scientific, or technical programs in the work of a Federal agency.

### b. ELIGIBILITY

Any woman in the Federal Government with not less than three years' continuous, full-time service in the competitive or excepted service, who has attained a rank equivalent to grade GS-9 or above, is eligible to compete for these awards. (No age limit)

### c. NOMINATIONS

Only three nominations may be submitted by each agency.
