The IC Staff was the only intelligence agency to sustain the 12% cut attributed to non-defense departments. I believe this was a serious mistake. It came at a particularly inopportune time for us because of concurrent Congressional action on the FY82 request. [redacted]

[redacted] I need your assistance to ensure that the Staff is not required to absorb the pay increases in what is already an unnecessarily austere budget. [redacted]

Failure or delay in funding the [redacted] could result in suspension of activities for a month, disrupting operation of vital intelligence systems or suspending work required for the operation of future systems in which very large investments are being made. This is not consistent with the Administration's policy to strengthen the Intelligence Community. [redacted]
