ABSTRACT

1. This report, presenting imagery-derived information on the upgrading of the Bulgarian
Air Force, provides information on the status and disposition of aircraft at 18 major military
airfields in Bulgaria. Because some aircraft are inside hardened aircraft bunkers, low numbers of
aircraft have been reported. All pertinent imagery acquired between

INTRODUCTION




FIGURE 1. LOCATIONS OF MAJOR BULGARIAN AIRFIELDS

2. The capability of the Bulgarian Air Force has been upgraded by the introduction of FLOGGER Gs to Sofia/Kumaritsa Airfield and FOXBAT Bs/Ds to Tolbukhin Airfield (Figure 1 and Table 1). The Bulgarian Air Force is the third Warsaw Pact nationalist air force to receive FLOG-GER Gs and the only one to receive FOXBATs. East Germany and Czechoslovakia are the other Warsaw Pact Countries with FLOGGER Gs. Prior to the arrival of FLOGGER and FOXBAT aircraft, FISHBEDs and FRESCOs were the major Bulgarian air defense and ground attack assets. (S/WN)

5. The introduction of FOXBAT B/D and FLOGGER G aircraft into Bulgaria will greatly enhance the reconnaissance, air intercept, and ground attack capabilities of the Bulgarian Air Force. The range of FOXBAT B/D aircraft is substantially greater than that of FISHBED H aircraft.1 The FLOGGER G is a significant upgrading from the FRESCO because of its greater range, its larger ordnance capability, and its more sophisticated avionics package.² (S/WN)
