SUBJECT: Invitation To Address the 1983 Graduate
Studies Program

1. Action Requested: We would be honored to have you address the CIA Graduate Studies Program participants at the formal opening of the 1983 program on 14 June 1983, from 11:00a.m. to 12:00 noon, in the Headquarters Auditorium. In the past, opening speakers have talked about the future of the Agency, with approximately thirty minutes set aside for questions from the students.

2. Background: The Graduate Studies Program began in 1966 with initial focus on Chinese area and language studies. It has gradually been expanded to include other geographical areas as well as economics, geography, law, psychology, engineering and other sciences. The program provides students the opportunity to do substantive scholarly research in their fields of academic concentrations. The majority of those selected have completed one or more years of graduate study, and all students selected must be committed to be in graduate school the fall following completion of the program. During their employment, the students have weekly briefing sessions with senior officials who acquaint them in detail with the work of the Agency. Since the graduate students have special clearances, briefing officials are candid in describing the activities, duties and responsibilities of their components. This same frankness prevails in their response to questions from the students following each presentation. Overall reaction to the briefings and assignments has been consistently favorable.

Competition for Graduate Studies Program positions increases each year. This year over 1,000 inquiries were received for the approximately 90 positions available. Over the years the intern program has proven mutually beneficial from both a short-range and long-range point of view. Interns have an opportunity to participate in the substantive work of the Agency and to become acquainted with professional foreign intelligence analysts.
