

I am very pleased that you said at the VOSS party you would be willing to accept my invitation to be the Keynote Speaker at a conference on terrorism. We have scheduled a major symposium on "Terrorism and Industry: Threat and Responses," at the International Club on October 14, 1985. I hope you can make it.

This meeting is being organized by the Strategic Center of SRI (Stanford Research Institute) International and SIFT, Inc., my private consulting company. Participants will include Chief Executive Officers of American industries and senior level experts from the U.S. and abroad. We feel they ought to get the word.
