

Dear Bill:

I received a thoughtful letter from a constituent who recently interviewed for a position at CIA. The individual -- who has spent a number of years in the military -- was asked why he was interested in a position at the Agency. He responded that he had had a long term interest in public service. The interviewer responded that CIA was not a "public service organization" but rather served a small segment of the government.

I bring this to your attention because I strongly feel that the professional ethic of an employee of the CIA must be founded on the realization that the Central Intelligence Agency fundamentally serves the interest of the American people. Employees must understand that service to the public includes accountability to the public as well. It is disturbing to find that an individual in this sensitive position of interviewing future employees does not grasp this fact.
