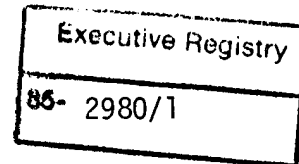

Again, we thank you for considering our invitation.

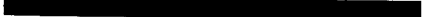




