SUBJECT: Policy - The Third World

This piece by Daniel Pipes which came out of a book on the Third World reminded me that there are a lot of people in the policy community who would like to have the facts updated and brought together on Soviet forced labor camps and colonialism within the Soviet Union. I am reminded of this by the attached map of the forced labor camps which appears as a cover lining to a new book on Stalin's secret war, against the people, during World War II, and particularly by this interesting article on Soviet Central Asia. I think this should be done in terms of Soviet vulnerability to a counterattack against their campaign against the West.
