Topics and thoughts for Mr. Hart's discussion with Component Safety Officers.

PURPOSE:

Here today to discuss the Agency's
Safety and Health Program and the role of
the Component Safety Officers in the
implementation of the Program.

BACKGROUND:

the Occupational Safety and Health Act, Executive Order 12196 and Title 29, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1960 which require and provide guidelines for the establishment and maintenance of an occupational safety and health program.

(These are covered in their initial briefing by the Safety Group).

establishes the
Agency's Safety and Health Program, sets forth
policy, authorities and responsibilities

Reference also that the Agency's

DETAILS:

requires that safety officers be designated and outlines their responsibilities.

regarding the Program.

Let's review several of the more important ones:

1. Conduct an annual safety and health inspection of your workplace. (Federal Guidelines require that every workplace, including office areas, be inspected at least annually.)

ONLY 16 inspection reports by

Component Safety Officers were received

during CY 1980. (70m/ 07 Approx. 85 Saremy 077mens)

2. Investigates occupational injuries, illnesses, accidents and fires involving Agency personnel, property and equipment. Submit Accident Report Form 2652a to the CIA Safety Officer.

Last year 85% of the injuries/
illnesses were reported properly,
compared to 73% in 1978. This is
certainly an improvement but should
be 100%. In many instances they
were not reported because the safety
officer was not aware of the incident.
Contact your Personnel and Logistics
Officers, get a notice out in your
components, let the employees and
supervisors know who their safety

officers are as well as responsibilities of both employees and safety officers.

Federal Guidelines (29 CFR 1960) require that each safety officer be given training commensurate with the scope of assigned safety and health responsibilities. The 3-day Basic Safety and Health Course conducted by the Safety Group is considered the minimum training required.

During 1980 the Safety Group conducted four 5-day and one 3-day courses - <u>yet</u> there are <u>still 48</u> safety officers who have not taken one of the training courses. (DCI - <u>13</u> of 15; NFAC - <u>6</u> of 14; DDA - <u>10</u> of 25; DDO - <u>14</u> of 17; DDS&T - <u>5</u> of 14)
