I would like to invite the continued participation of the Central Intelligence Agency in the Atlantic Council's Senior Fellowship Program for the 1986-87 academic year. This will be the sixth year of our Senior Fellowship Program.

During the current year, we have officers in our program from the Army, the Navy, the Air Force, and the Department of State, as well as from the Central Intelligence Agency. During the time they have spent with the Council, we have been extremely pleased with the contributions to our policy programs and the research activity of [redacted] our current Senior Fellows from the Agency. These highly qualified analysts are active, articulate, and essential participants in numerous Council activities. In addition to his own research, [redacted] has contributed significantly to the Council's current policy projects on Strategic Stability and US Policy Toward the Soviet Union. He has carried out valuable research for the Council in connection with our special policy project on International Terrorism. [redacted] has undertaken a heavy research load for the Mexican component of the Council's major policy project on Integrating Economic Policy and Security Policy.

We are convinced that the Senior Fellowship Program provides mutual advantages to both the Agency and the Atlantic Council, and therefore extend again the opportunity for participation by the Agency.

The Council's Senior Fellowship Program provides outstanding individuals with an opportunity to further expand their knowledge and understanding of international affairs through a program of individual study and research, and through extensive participation in the Council's program of working groups on policy projects and regular meetings at which Senior Fellows' research is discussed.

During the year they are with us, Senior Fellows have the opportunity to investigate a wide range of political, economic, security and informational problems and multilateral means of dealing with them. They are able to meet, hear, and work with the exceptionally qualified present and former civilian and military government officials, business leaders and academics who make up the Council's Board of Directors and its Committees and Working Groups. The policy projects that the Council will be conducting during the coming year include:

- o Defending Peace and Freedom: Toward Strategic Stability in the Year 2000.
- o US Policy Toward the Soviet Union: A Long-Term Western Perspective, 1985-2000.
- o The Successor Generation Programs and Young Leaders' Seminars.
- o Combatting International Terrorism: US-European Cooperation and Political Will.
- o Western Interests and US Policy Options in the Middle East.
- o Integrating Economic Policy and Security Policy, including task groups on 1) Assuring Continued Western Technological Leadership; 2) US Policy Toward Canada: Guidelines for the Next Decade; 3) Western Interests and US Policy Options in Mexico; 4) Balancing National Contributions to Western Security: Burdensharing Redefined; 5) Addressing Problems Facing the International Trading System; 6) The Future of the International Monetary System.
- o The Interrelationship of Atlantic and Pacific Issues: Allied Interests and US Policy Options.
- o US-Japan Energy Relationships in the 1980s.
- o Energy Supply and Use in Developing Countries.
- o The Pacific Caucus of Parliamentarians.

In addition, in May 1985 the Council established a NATO Information Office under a resident Director. This office is responsible for conducting a range of programs for publicizing and promoting support for NATO in the United States.

Participation in the policy projects and the Council's other activities provides a Senior Fellow with the opportunity to secure wider understanding and perspectives on a broad range of international issues, and the interrelationship of political, economic, security and ideological factors. Senior Fellows will have the opportunity to perform research and contribute background papers related to the policy projects. In addition, Senior Fellows will be expected to carry out individual research projects in accordance with their background and qualifications.

Atlantic Council Senior Fellows will be chosen from Agency nominees by a Selection Committee made up of selected Directors of the Council, which I will chair.

Fellowships are held for one year, preferably commencing in September 1986. In lieu of tuition, there will be a residence fee of \$7,000.00 per year per Senior
