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

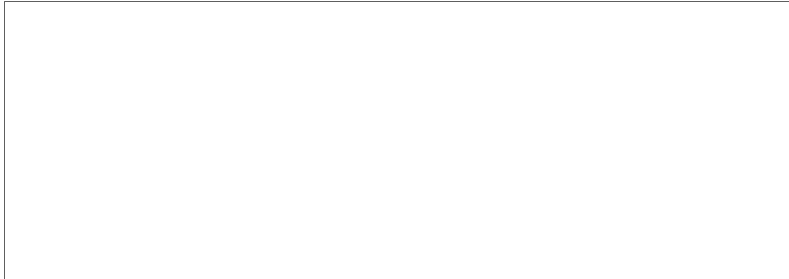

REMARKS BY JOHN J. MCMAHON AT THE ANNUAL
"AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE" DINNER HOSTED BY THE
IRON WORKERS EMPLOYERS ASSOCIATION
OF WASHINGTON, D.C. (I.W.E.A.)
THE CONGRESSIONAL COUNTRY CLUB
APRIL 25, 1986

I THOUGHT THAT OUR GUESTS WOULD LIKE TO KNOW EXACTLY WHO THE IWEA OF WASHINGTON IS AND WHAT WE DO. WE ARE AN ORGANIZATION OF CONTRACTORS....STRUCTURAL, MISCELLANEOUS AND ARCHITECTURAL METAL FABRICATORS AND ERECTORS. OUR RANKS INCLUDE THE LARGE AND THE SMALL AND REPRESENT THE MANY DIVERSE SEGMENTS OF OUR INDUSTRY - THE STRUCTURAL STEEL BUILDING AND BRIDGE FABRICATORS AND ERECTORS, THE MISCELLANEOUS, ORNAMENTAL AND ARCHITECTURAL FABRICATORS AND ERECTORS, AND INCLUDING THE SKYLIGHT, WINDOW, CURTAIN WALL, GLAZING, PRECAST CONCRETE ERECTORS AND SPECIALTY CONTRACTORS.

OURS IS AN ORGANIZATION OF BUILDERS WHO HAVE INITIATED AND SUPPORTED PROGRAMS TO BUILD A BETTER INDUSTRY. WE TRY TO BUILD A BETTER INDUSTRY IMAGE TO ENHANCE THE PUBLIC PERCEPTION OF THE TOTAL CONSTRUCTION COMMUNITY, AND BUILDING BETTER LABOR RELATIONS AND BETTER LABOR AGREEMENTS TO INCREASE PRODUCTIVITY AND SAFETY.

OUR MEMBERS CONTRACTORS BELIEVE IN THE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING CONCEPT, AND WE BELIEVE IN THE FORMAL APPRENTICESHIP SYSTEM WORKING IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE IRONWORKERS UNION. OUR MEMBER CONTRACTORS SERVE WITHOUT PAY ON THE JOINT APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING COMMITTEE TO PROVIDE PROPER DIRECTION FOR THE APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM AND A FAIR PROGRAM FOR THE ENTRY OF MINORITIES. OUR MEMBERS SERVE WITHOUT PAY AS TRUSTEES ON THE HEALTH AND WELFARE AND

PENSION FUNDS TO INSURE THE FISCAL INTEGRITY OF THESE FUNDS. WE BELIEVE IN COOPERATION WITH THE IRON WORKERS UNION FOR A COMPETITIVE AND MORE PRODUCTIVE INDUSTRY. AS THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY EXPANDS TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE COUNTRY IN THE 1980'S AND 1990'S IT IS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY THAT PEOPLE BE PROPERLY TRAINED IN CRAFTSMANSHIP TO PROVIDE QUALITY CONSTRUCTION. IT TAKES TRAINING AND KNOWLEDGE TO PRODUCE BUILDING TRADESMEN WHO CAN TAKE BOXES AND CRATES OF MATERIAL, TRAILER LOADS OF RAW STOCK...AND AT WHAT AMOUNTS TO A FACTORY AT EACH BUILDING SITE, PRODUCE A BUILDING FROM THESE BITS AND PIECES. THESE BUILDINGS MUST BE STRUCTURALLY SOUND, PROPERLY LAID OUT, PLUMB AND SQUARE IF THE OTHER COMPONENTS ARE TO FIT AND OPERATE PROPERLY.THE WALL AND ROOFING SYSTEMS CANNOT LEAK,....BUT QUALITY WORK CANNOT BE DONE BY PEOPLE WHO ARE NOT PROPERLY TRAINED. WE HAVE ALL SEEN THE SORRY EXAMPLES OF CONSTRUCTION ON PROJECTS WHICH WERE TRIED BY UNTRAINED PEOPLE. THE TROUBLED HOUSING MARKET IS THE PRIME EXAMPLE OF POOR CONSTRUCTION PRACTICES PERFORMED BY PEOPLE WHO ARE NOT PROPERLY TRAINED, AND RECENTLY WE HAVE SEEN THE SPREAD OF MEDIOCRITY AND WORSE INTO THE COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION MARKET.

WE ARE AN ORGANIZATION OF FAMILY OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES, MANY OF WHOM ARE IN THE SECOND AND THIRD GENERATION OF OWNERSHIP AND OPERATION. THE MEMBERS OF THIS ORGANIZATION ARE PROUD OF THE CONTRIBUTIONS WHICH WE HAVE

MADE AND WILL MAKE TO THE BUILDING INDUSTRY AND TO THE OWNERS OF CONSTRUCTION. WE ARE CONFIDENT THAT STRUCTURAL STEEL IS THE SUPERIOR FRAMING SYSTEM FOR BUILDINGS....COMBINING WITH CELLULAR STEEL DECK FOR THE MOST VERSATILE AND ECONOMICAL LIFE CYCLE FLOORING SYSTEM FOR OFFICE BUILDINGS. OUR MISCELLANEOUS AND ORNAMENTAL METAL PRODUCTS ARE MADE TO LAST FOR GENERATIONS AND HAVE THE CLEAN, CRISP LINES TO SATISFY THE MOST EXACTING DEMANDS OF AN ARCHITECT. WE ARE PLEASED THAT THERE ARE OWNERS WHO HAVE THE WISDOM TO SELECT THE VERY BEST PEOPLE FOR THEIR DESIGN TEAMS, WHO ARE WILLING TO PAY THAT LITTLE BIT EXTRA FOR THE FINEST IN BUILDING MATERIALS AND THE FINEST IN THE WAY OF CRAFTSMANSHIP TO ASSEMBLE THE BUILDING PRODUCTS AT THE SITE INTO AN OUTSTANDING FINISHED PRODUCT. THESE ARE THE MONUMENTAL BUILDINGS WHICH WILL ENDURE AND FUNCTION LONG AFTER THE SO-CALLED "BARGAIN BUILDINGS" HAVE BECOME A BLIGHT ON THE LANDSCAPE. WITH THAT SAID, LET'S MOVE ON TO THE "AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE."

OUR AWARDS COMMITTEE SIFTED THROUGH THE MANY FINE PROJECTS WHICH WERE NOMINATED AND AS USUAL, THEY CAME OUT WITH A DYNAMITE CHOICE. WE FEEL THAT IT IS CONSTRUCTIVE FOR SPECIAL RECOGNITION TO BE GIVEN TO THE OWNERS, A/E DESIGN TEAMS AND BUILDERS WHO EXHIBIT THOSE QUALITIES WHICH SET THEM APART AND ABOVE THE AVERAGE LEVEL OF COMPETENCY IN THEIR FIELD.

THIS YEAR, THE SELECTION OF THE "C.I.A. NEW BUILDING PROJECT" WAS A DESERVING CHOICE FROM AMONG THE MANY FINE BUILDINGS CONSTRUCTED IN THE WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN AREA. THE C.I.A. PROJECT IS A TEXTBOOK EXAMPLE OF INSPIRED ARCHITECTURE BY HARMONIZING THE REQUIRED BULK OF THE COMPLEX WITH THE ADJOINING LANDSCAPE. THIS TASTEFUL BLENDING OF LANDSCAPE AND BUILDING HAS CREATED "A SENSE OF PLACE", A PLACE TO WORK CREATIVELY.... WITH INTERIOR SPACE TREATMENT ACHIEVING A NEW DIMENSION IN FUNCTIONAL FREEDOM FOR MONUMENTAL OFFICE STRUCTURES. THE C.I.A. HEADQUARTERS WILL STAND PROUD AS AN EXAMPLE OF WHAT CAN BE DONE BY THOSE WHO ARE DEDICATED TO DOING THEIR VERY BEST IN THEIR CHOSEN VOCATION.
