There is no planning underway, no prospect for a summit," White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater told reporters when asked whether there was 14: any possibility for Reagan and Gorbachev to get together one 15: 16: more time before the end of Reagan's term. 17: On another matter, Fitzwater said a Central Intelligence Agency (CIA official's harsh assessment of the nature of the 18: Soviet threat faced by the United States following a Soviet 19: political shakeup was "totally consistent" with the views of 20: 21: the White House. "The president has good relations with General Secretary 22: 23: Gorbachev, but the system is the same, the country is the same and the threat is the same and we need to be quite aware of 24: 25: that," Fitzwater told reporters. Deputy CIA Director Robert Gates said in a recent speech 26: that Corbachev faced overwhelming opposition and apathy to his 27: political reforms and it was doubtful whether he could fix the 28: staggering Soviet economy. 30: "The dictatorship of the Communist Party remains untouched and untouchable," Gates said following the shakeup in Politburo 31: 32: membership orchastrated by Gorbachev. Fitzwater said Gates' comments were "totally consistent with what we've been saying in terms of our policy toward the 34: 35: Soviet Union." 36: He said Reagan and Defence Secretary Frank Carlucci had often pointed out in speeches that "action speaks louder than words from the Soviets and what we want to see is a reduction in their defence budget as the best indicator of a change in 39: 40: policy with regard to their defence posture."
