# SURVIVABLE AND ENDURING INTELLIGENCE SYSTEM (SEIS)

This addendum provides supplemental classification guidance for the DRSP activity "Survivable and Enduring Intelligence System (SEIS)." In those cases where the classification guidance provided in this addendum conflicts with that provided in the reference guidelines (BYE 28579/81), the guidance in this addendum is to be followed.

The DRSP activity "Survivable and Enduring Intelligence System (SEIS)" involves concept definition studies for a system which would supplement present and projected enduring intelligence and intelligence-related capabilities. Because reconnaissance satellites will be the primary means used for this collection, many of the details of this effort will remain within the BYEMAN system until a decision on system acquisition is reached. At that time, a decision will be rendered on the appropriate classification level for the program and a more detailed classification guide will be published.
