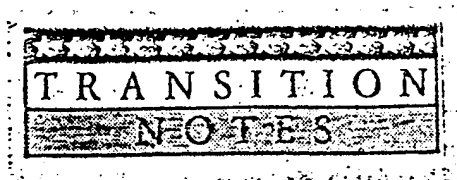

The National Security Council for the new White House is beginning to take shape.

Richard Pipes, a Harvard professor and leader of a group of outside experts that issued a dissenting, more alarmist, view of Soviet power during the last part of the Ford administration, is expected to join the NSC as an authority on Soviet affairs.

And James Lilley, former chief of Chinese affairs for the Central Intelligence Agency, is expected to be an Asian expert on the NSC.
