Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am replying to your letter of February 2, enclosing for review and declassification three transcripts sanitized in 1969 when they were printed.

We have no objection to the release of the previously withheld material you have bracketed in red except for the portions we have bracketed with blue ink. We recommend that these parts be withheld under the relevant subsections of Executive Order 12356 which we have noted in the margin. Release of this material could be expected to have a detrimental effect on U.S. foreign policy interests in Southeast Asia, particularly as regards our relations with Thailand, an important treaty ally, India and Laos, and our support for improved Thai-Lao relations.

We understand that the Department of Defense will be asked to review this material. We recommend it also be submitted to the Central Intelligence Agency. We have noted these agencies in the margin of those portions we have no objections to release but believe that they may have an interest.
