SUBJECT: Arms Control Intelligence Briefing, No. 2 SSCI, SASC and HPSCI Staff Members

1. Intelligence analysts from CIA, DIA and State/INR briefed Congressional staff members on Soviet LRINF forces and capabilities on 30 September 1987, 1000 to 1230 hours at SHOB 219. This was the second briefing of a series to review Soviet military strategy and capabilities in preparation for arms control treaty considerations by the Congress.

3. The briefing followed the topics listed on the attachment for each of the four briefers. Out of the discussion, several other highlights should be mentioned.

-D/ACIS in response to a question mentioned that the Intelligence Community would be evaluating data in an MOU to be exchanged with the Soviets at Geneva about 9 October. This was the first occasion in which the Congressional staffers became aware that the US and USSR were to exchange specific details about missile deployment in preparation for an INF treaty.
