1. Glien Curtis of the Department of State called to indicate that they had received a letter on the [redacted] case from Senator Hennings. I informed him that the Army also had received a letter and that they had some indication that the matter should be held in abeyance while the counsel for Hennings' Subcommittee on Constitutional Rights contacted [redacted]. It was suggested to Curtis that he confirm the accuracy of this statement and also request authority to use the information in their handling of the [redacted] letter. Curtis will do so and advise us further.

2. Talked with Miss Hussey on the staff of the House Foreign Affairs Committee and retrieved a copy of the Tribuna Popular which had been left there this morning. I also requested two copies of the transcript when it is available which apparently will be early tomorrow morning. The reporting firm concerned is Cochran Helmes Reporting Company, Washington, D. C., Sterling 3-1633.

3. Talked with John Wittek of the Senate Appropriations Committee and advised him of the error on page 17 of the hearings on the Second Supplemental Appropriations Bill 1958 (H. R. 10821). After informing him of the nature of the error about the number of pages translated being a gross figure including both classified and unclassified he thought that no further action was required since the error in any event was not injurious to the request of OTS for appropriations. Therefore, no further action will be taken.
