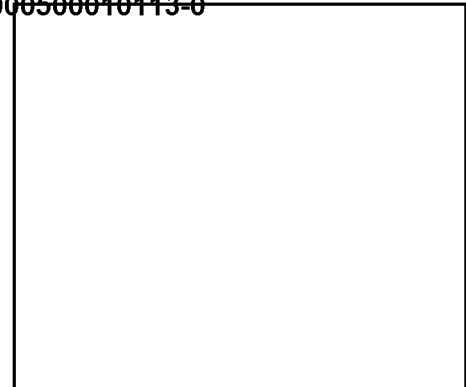

Tuesday - March 25, 1958

Met with Congressman Judd for about one hour and delivered to him a copy of the factual statement of the [redacted] case and a copy of the [redacted] report with true names of accused persons deleted. In addition he was given a copy of the findings of the Army Board at Frankfurt. It was explained to him that true names had been deleted in the report because of concern of the publication of a libel. Judd did not appear excited or unreasonable on the case but said the pressure was on him and on the basis of the facts as presently known to him he simply could not understand the actions taken. Apparently he has asked [redacted] for reports from the two private psychiatrists seen by him but has received nothing. Judd clearly indicated that [redacted] himself has not asked Judd for anything but that his mother has pressed the case and privately Judd said he is of the opinion that she is the one who should have been committed.
