- PURPOSE. The purpose of this Bulletin is to announce changes in wage rates made under authority conferred upon the Director by the Department of Treasury.
- SCOPE. This announcement covers positions in occupational groups specified below. These schedules reflect a decision with regard to certain journeyman rates of pay established at the U. S. Government Printing Office (GPO) in compliance with a decision by the Joint Committee on Printing.
- a. Compositor and Maintenance Trades and Crafts. This adjustment affects approximately 259 employees in job classifications related to the Compositor and Maintenance Trades and Crafts whose rates are adjusted from time to time as is consistent with rates prevailing in the U. S. Government Printing Office.
- Electrolytic Plate Makers. This schedule covers approximately 14 employees in the Electrolytic Plate Maker Craft whose rates are adjusted from time to time as is consistent with rates prevailing at the U.S. Government Printing Office.
- Photoengravers. This adjustment affects approximately 18 employees in the Photoengraving Craft whose rates are adjusted from time to time as is consistent with rates prevailing in the U. S. Government Printing Office.
- Bookbinders. This adjustment affects approximately 70 employees in job classifications related to the Bookbinder Craft whose rates are adjusted from time to time as is consistent with rates prevailing in the U.S. Government Printing Office.
- Pressmen. This adjustment affects approximately 68 employees in job classifications related to the Pressman Craft whose rates are adjusted from time to time as is consistent with rates prevailing in the U.S. Government Printing Office.
