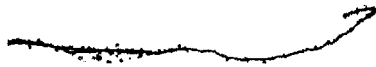

Like giant chessmen, mud-brick pigeon towers dot the landscape near Isfahan (following pages). Built in the 17th century by melon farmers, each of these 20-foot high rises collected and stored natural fertilizer from as many as 10,000 live-in pigeons, which raided outlying wheat fields. Today, their glory years ended by chemical fertilizers, the towers are neglected and largely empty.
