REMARKS

1. (U) <u>PURPOSE</u>: To obtain approval for the attached statement of work (SOW) and the expenditure of \$150K of DIA funds to support it.

2. (U) BACKGROUND:

- a. (C) This contract covers the first year of a planned three year program supported by the Army and DIA, as described in the attached memorandum of understanding (MOU). (Encl. 1) The MOU calls for a three year, joint program but does not commit the parties to any particular contractor.
- b. (S) In accordance with DoD Directive 5240.1-R re: human experimentation, permission has been obtained for the conduct of this contract. (Encl. 2)
 - c. (U) Funds are available per RS memo S-020/RCC-2, 10 Feb 81. (Encl. 3)

3. (U) DISCUSSION:

- a. (S) The objective of this contract is to investigate the military applications from a threat assessment standpoint (both offensive and defensive) of psychoenergetic phenomena; with emphasis or remote viewing. The prior DIA contract dealtowith operational techniques to establish reliability and authenticity parameters.
- b. (U) The Army is contributing \$120Klank FYe 81 which will be added as an accommendmentato the work begun with DIA's share of \$150K. The resulting total of \$270Klas intended to fund the entire SOW at enclosure 4.8 Receipt and acceptance of the Army money is a separate action. Specific tasks to be funded by DIA and the the Army are identified in the MIPR Control Provisions in the SOW. SOW.
- c. (U) The attached SOW has been reviewed and approved by the GRILL FLAME committee, as required by the MOU.

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(U) RECOMMENDATION:

- a. (U) That the attached SOW be approved and forwarded with a requisition for \$150K to DSS-W for processing.
- b. (U) That, upon acceptance by DIA of the Army funds for this joint contract, a second requisition in that amount be prepared and sent, without further Contract Review Board action, to DSS-W for amending action.

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GRILL FLAME

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This joint three year GRILL FLAME effort is intended to implement a comprehensive effort designated from the outset to determine the operational parameters and usefulness of certain elements of psychoenergetics and assess the threat these phenomena pose to the National security. The DoD GRILL FLAME effort will include, but not be limited to, external assistance contracts. It is recognized that each participant reserves the right to discontinue participation in this program at the end of each fiscal year. Each participant reserves the right to enter into GRILL FLAME contracts with parties independent of the terms for the approval of joint contracts by the GRILL FLAME Committee. The GRILL FLAME Committee will seek throughout the first year, and continually during follow on years, to examine capabilities in remote viewing (RV) and psychokinetics (PK) developed by potential contractors and unanimously agree to contract with the contractors who can best meet the requirements of the DoD at the least possible cost.

a. The DIA will:

- (1) Issue joint contracts to accomplish the required external support.
- (2) Chair the GRILL FLAME Committee and provide, in coordination without committee members, regular progress reports to appropriate high level decisionmakers.
- (3) Provides the primary contract monitors to be located where the she can can best monitors all joints contracts accs.
 - b. The participants (DIA and Army) will:
 - (1) Contribute to the development of contracts goals, unanimously agree

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to the contract goals, and outline specific requirements, tasks, and priorities to be accomplished by the joint contracts.

- (2) MIPR funds to DIA for the first year of the joint contracts.
- (3) Host the quarterly GRILL FLAME Committee meetings on a rotating basis. The first quarter meeting by Army.
- (4) Provide ORV monitors and viewer to support the programs when appropriate.
 - (5) Total Program dollar efforts for FY 81 are as follows:

- c. The GRILL FLAME Comittee will:
- (1) Be composed of members from DIA and Army and will consist of two voting members from each organization.
- (2) Review the DIA and Army requirements for psychoenergetics and incorporate them into the contract work statements, thereby ensuring that the program will meet the requirements of each contributor.
- (3) Prepare all final GRILL FLAME joint contracts and determine priorities is.
- (4) Provide continual review of all GRILL FLAME joint contractual matters, to include, when appropriate, review by cleared parties both within and outside the DoD.
- (5) During the quarterly meetings, review and critique past work and revise, as needed, the next quarter swork.
- (6) Will Wdetermines the all-locations of MIPRA defunds mannings to specific fide contractual stasks asks.
- (7) Provide scientific and technical expertise needed to guide the contractual investigations.

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- (8) Serves as an advisory group to DIA on collection priorities for application of ORV techniques to real targets.
- (9) Will be kept fully advised of participant independent GRILL FLAME activities.
 - d. The primary contract monitor will:
 - (1) Be cognizant of all GRILL FLAME joint contracts.
 - (2) Serve as an interface between the Committee and all contractors.
- (3) Ensure that all raw data produced by the contractors is shared by all the participants.
- (4) In coordination and concurrence with the Committee, relay guidance to the contractors.
 - (5) Report contract results to the GRILL FLAME Committee.
 - (6) Ensure research goals are met.
- (7) Be responsive to all inquiries by participants as to the activities and progress being made by the contractors.
- (8) Be responsive to all inquiries by other DoD or governmental agencies on the status of the contract research in keeping with established security guidelines and approval of the Committee tea.



> > 1. (U) Reference DT memo dated 2 Feb 1981 (attached) which discusses the status of the GRILL FLAME Project.

- (S) The FY 1981 shortfall of \$150,000 can be made available from 2. Agency reserves as a result of analysis of ongoing contracts. There will be no adverse impact on any agency program as a result of this reallocation.
- (S) For FY 1982, sufficient funds to cover the GRILL FLAME shortfall have been requested as part of the amendment to the FY 1982 Budget now under consideration at the IC Staff. If this request is not part of the Budget Amendment sent to Congress, the reallocation of funds from the DT efforts shown at enclosure 4 of referenced memo will be required.
- (S) Recommend that upon receiving the necessary approval from the Deputy Secretary of Defense under Procedure 18 of DoD Directive 5240.1-R, the \$150,000 required for GRILL FLAME in FY 1981 be reallocated from Agency reserve. Also recommend that should funding for GRILL FLAME not be included in the FY 1982 Budget Amendment, the reallocation of funds proposed by DT from the project on nuclear reactor power and project SUDDEN DAWN be approved.

COLLECTION TECHNIQUES (PSYCHOENERGETICSTHREAT TO US AND POTENTIAL APPLICATIONS)

1. General

The objective of this effort is to investigate in detail certain psychoenergetic phenomena that have potential military applications. Emphasis will be on evaluating application potential and limitations of such phenomena, and to provide such knowledge as gained under this contract to appropriate DoD agencies who will evaluate the significance of foreign work, particularly as it may pose a threat to the US.

Major emphasis will be on evaluating remote viewing phenomena and in particular, targeting aspects, via coordinate or other methods. Related to this are training methods, methods of enhancing reliability and repeatability of the phenomena.

2.0 Specific Tasks (FY 81)

- 2.1 Develop audio/semantic analysis techniques to separate correct from incorrect data available from taped viewer descriptions of remote viewing sites and to provide selective editing under operational conditions.
- 2.2 Determine what is required for target acquistion (names, maps, coordinates, pictures, arbitrary labelings, simply the word "target", etc.)
- 2.3 2 Evaluate threat potential of foreign remote viewing = type type investigations:
- 2.3.1 Simulate experimental results for which there is data to a assess validity of the foreign research.
- 2.3.2 Assess military applications potential of the foreign research (or claims), particularly where a threat to US security is possible.
- 2.3.3. Assess feasibility of the most significant applications and and evaluate dimitations are

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- 2.3.4 Evaluate the use of remote viewing to locate target objects or people.
- 2.3.5 Evaluate the use of remote viewing for event detection and to locate events.
- 2.3.6 Evaluate the use of remote viewing to detect the presence or absence of targets.
- 2.3.7 Evaluate the potential of various camouflage, concealment and deception as countermeasures to remote viewing.
- 2.3.8 Investigate the effects of the following variables on the remote viewing phenomena. (a) accuracy. (b) degree of resolution. (c) affect on the sensory inputs (feel, smell, touch, etc.).
- 2.3.9 Determine potential of remote viewing to assess other types of information, such as specific S&T data, or function/purpose of facilities or activities.
- 2.4. It is anticipated that during the contract period there will be quick reaction tasks approved by the Grill Flame Committee, passed through the COTR and levied on the contractor. These will be of high priority and will require prompt attention.



- 3, Security Requirements: It is expected that a maximum of six SI/SAO billets will be required to properly support the program. If and when SRI International commences work on operational situations, it is required that all personnel connected with operational matters possess the necessary clearances.
 - 4. Deliverables: The contractor shall provide the following:
- 4.1 Quarterly Reports to highlight accomplishments and resources expenditures (by specific tasks the amount of funding, equipment used, Professional/Support man hours). Detail progress on each sub-task designated for examination during the quarter will be completed by the contractor.
- 4.2 Draft Final Report using the same format as the Quarterly Reports but covering the entire contract period.
- 4.3 A Final Report based on the Draft Final Report and the comments made by the COTR.
- 4.4 Program progress briefing shall be of an informal nature and shall be held at the end of each quarter. The contractor shall furnish copies of informal charts, viewgraphs and other aids as may be needed. The informal briefings shall consist of a contractor presentation and informal discussion among contractor, funding agencies and other government personnel as appropriate.
- 4.5 Quick reaction reports as required by the COTR. They will be of limited scope and deal with subjects of especially high interest and/or critical timeliness.

- 4.6 All supporting material, i.e. notes, maps, tapes for this contract will be made available by the contractor to the COTR and no such material will be destroyed without written permission.
- 5. Delivery Schedule: The COTR will insure members of the Grill Flame Committee receive copies of all deliverables.
- 5.1 Quarterly Reports: Five copies to the COTR. The first report is due 100 days after the contract award date and will cover the first 90 days of the contract. Subsequent reports will be due each 90 days thereafter, i.e., 190 days after contract award, 280 days, 370 days, etc.
- 5.2 Draft Final Report: Five copies to the COTR within 30 days of completion of the contract. Comments will be returned to the contractor within 45 days of receipt of the draft.
- 5.3 Final Report: Ten copies and a camera ready master to the COTR within 45 days of receipt of the comments made on the Draft Final Report.
- 5.4 Program Progress Briefings: Approximately 4 per year are anticipated. Specific times and places will be established by the COTR. Some briefings will occur in the Washington, DC area and may involve more than one presentation by the contractors.
- 5.5 Quick Reaction Reports: Number of copies, place and time of delivery to be determined by the COTR.


