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

Comment: Although the technical aspects of the agreement covering American air bases in France have been settled since early August, Pleven has avoided setting a date for signature.

The Embassy states that for some time Pleven has been "difficult" on anything relating to the United States. This attitude presumably stems from his failure to win additional American financing for French armament production. planning to use the air-base agreement as a bargaining weapon.
