



Widespread demonstrations on 20 August would probably result in considerable bloodshed--particularly if by that time Paris has not announced a policy for Morocco or replaced Grandval. Removal of the present sultan. Mohamed ben Arafa, the minimum demand of Moroccan nationalists, would on the other hand incite the French settlers to resort to violence.

French premier Faure recently told American representatives in Paris that Grandval is his personal choice as resident general, and he intends to back him.
