- 1. AT ABOUT 1108 HOURS DE DAY IN HID-APRIL 1071, A U.S.

  CUBRA HELICOPTER WAS SHOT DOWN BY 12.8MM ANTIAIRCRAFT MACHINE.

  GUN FIRE OF THE F-216 INFANTRY REGIMENT, VIET CONG (VC) 5TH

  DIVISION AT XU476455 NEAR SEANG VILLAGE. SNUOL DISTRICT.

  KRATIE PROVINCE, CAMBODIA. TWO CREWMEN GOT OUT DF THE COBRA
  AFTER THE CRASH AND CLIMBED A NEARBY TREE. ONE OF THE CREWMEN

  TOOK AIM TO FIRE AT VC PERSONNEL ATTEMPTING TO CAPTURE HIM.

  AND HIS COMPANION AND WAS SHOT TO DEATH. THE OTHER WAS

  CAPTURED BY VC SCLDIERS OF THE 6TH COMPANY. 2ND BATTALION.

  F-218 INFANTRY REGIMENT AFTER HIS PISTOL RAN OUT OF AHMUNITION.

  A VC CADRE WHO TOOK PART IN THE CAPTURE HAD HIS RIGHT ARK

  BROKEN BY A SHOT FROM ONE OF THE CREWMEN.
  - 2. BOTH OF THE CREWNEN WERE CAUCASIAN AND HAD LIGHT TOMPLEXIONS. OBSERVED THE CREWNAN WHO WAS

TAKEN PRISONER OF MAR (POW) FROM A DISTANCE OF ABOUT 40 HETERS WHEN HE WAS BEING ESCORTED ON FOOT IN THE DIRECTION OF KRATIE CITY. HE HAS ABOUT 1.80 HETERS TALL, HEIGHED ABOUT 90 KILOS. AND HORE A GREEN SHORT-SLEEVED FLIGHT UNIFORM. HIS HRISTS HERE TIED WITH A NYLON RCPE AND HIS BOOTS HAD BEEN REHOVED.

ABOUT THREE DAYS LATER HENT TO THE CRASH SITE IN SEARCH OF WALUABLES AND FOUND THE GODY OF THE DEAD CREWHAN. HIS BODY HAS LYING UNCOVERED ON THE GROUND, BUT DID NOT GO CLOSE SECAUSE OF ITS BAD SHELL. LATER HEARD THAT THE BODY WAS CREHATED ON THE SPOT ONE WEEK LATER BY CAHBODIAN CIVILIANS WHO CAME TO THE CRASH SITE TO SALVAGE PARTS FROM THE WRECKAGE.

THE HELICOPTER DID NOT BURN WHEN IT HIT THE GROUND, AND WE PERSONNEL HERE SUCCESSFUL IN SALVAGING GASOLINE, THO MACHINE.

GUNS, THO PISTOLS, AND OTHER UNIDENTIFIED ITEMS.

COMMENT SAID THE CRASH SITE WAS LOCATED IN A VC-CONTROLLED AREA. HE SAID HE COULD LOCATE IT AGAIN, BUT THAT HE HOULD BE HILLING TO GUIDE A SEARCH PARTY BACK TO THE AREA ONLY IF HE HERE PROVIDED FULL SECURITY PROTECTION WAS SHOWN THE ALBUMS OF PHOTOGRAPHS OF MISSING AND CAPTURED PERSONNEL IN SOUTHEAST ASIA BUT HAS UNABLE TO IDENTIFY ANY OF THE PHOTOGRAPHS:)

EVALUATED THE REPORT AS FOLLOWS: "THO INCIDENTS ON 17 MARCH 1971 POSSIBLY CORRELATE TO THIS REPORT!

TA, U.S. ARMY 1ST LT LAKRENCE E. L T L L Y WAS THE CO-PILOT OF AN AH-1G AIRCRAFT. IT WAS FORCED DOWN AT A LANDING ZONE AT XU488458 BECAUSE OF SHALL ARMS GROUND-TO-AIR FIRE. THE PILOT OF THE AIRCRAFT. ARKY CAPT DAVID P. S C H N E I T Z E R. WAS RESCUED. LT LILLY WAS LAST SEEN BY U.S. PERSONNEL LAYING ON HIS BACK WITH HIS SHIRT PARTIALLY OPEN AND BLOOD ON HIS CHEST AND NECK. HE HAS OBSERVED BEING FIRED UPON BY VC. JCRC CARRIES LT LILLY IN STATUS OF DEAD. BODY-NOT-RECOVERED.

THIS INCIDENT. HE SAYS THAT SP4 DIX, ALTHOUGH MOUNDED IN THE APPER RIGHT ANKLE, WAS AMBULATORY AND HAS EVADING AT THE TIME OF HIS (HESTAND'S) CAPTURE. HESTAND ALSO REMARKED THAT, WHEN LAST SEEN, CH2 BAUMAN WAS ALIVE. IN GOOD CONDITION, AND WAS HIDING WITH DIX. IN HIS MOMECOMING DEBRIEF, HESTAND SAYS THAT HARRIS IS DEAD. WHEN HESTAND, HARRIS, AND DIX INITIALLY EXITED THE AIRCRAFT, HESTAND MENT TO THE PLACE WHERE HARRIS! BODY HAD BEEN THROWN. HE NOTICED THROAT LACERATIONS AND A DISCOLORATION OF THE BODY, WHICH, IN HESTAND'S OPINION, INDICATED THAT THE MAN WAS DEAD. JCRC CONTINUES TO CARDY WARDIS IN A STATUS OF MISSING-IN-ACTION.
